He brought along another young, outstanding orchid grower, Matthew McKnight from Waianae. For the month of February, we welcome Roy Tokunaga, a well-known grower and hybridizer of orchids in Hawaii, and renowned nationally and internationally. I hope you will take advantage of this opportunity to come and enjoy Roy's personal orchid presentation at our February 6th meeting.
