Thank you everyone for your support of the Kunia Orchid Society. Our in-person meeting attendance for the year started in the twenties in January but we are now inching forward into the thirties. Not a lot but moving upward. It does not compare to when our attendance was averaging in the high eighties three years ago, but we are still enjoy sharing orchid knowledge and appreciation for orchids together. For our April meeting we had a hands-on activity learning to repot using Styrofoam, fir bark, perlite, ties and stakes for stabilization, slow-release fertilizer, dolomite and plastic pots. We were able to repot Dendrobium Burana 'Horny,' Maxillaria tenuifolia and take home already successfully repotted. Members were also able to take home small Dendrobium Enobi to practice what they learned at the meeting.
