We Present our Offering

Finance - Matt J. - Budget proposal to be presented and voted on in December. Main increases will be from staff raises and insurance costs.

Worship - Kimberly A. - Last meeting was November 9, 2023. Delores led the meeting. Hymns were selected through November. The organ was tuned. Decorations to be placed November 30, 2023 at 5:00pm with a meal to follow.

Inspire - Gina S. - No recent meetings. Attendance has been good. Discussions and ideas for Christmas to be had. The structure is getting much more familiar with many different readers for the recordings. Things are also being well received by the youth.

Stewardship - Connie K. - Unsure of the next meeting day.

Youth - Weston W. - Nothing New. New Years Eve Mark is planning to take the 20 somethings to Switchfoot at the Surf Ballroom. Attendance has been steady, typically 15 or so "Jr's" on Sundays and 25/30 "Sr's" on Wednesdays.

Education - Mariah B. - The Christmas program will be the 17th of December at 9am. They will have cookies and treats to follow. They are working on getting the kids ready. Best year for attendance with both the kids and parents! Things are going very well.

Property - Doug F. - They are working on bids for gutters and necessary accessories. Two have come through from a company in Nora Springs and another from Clear Lake.

A motion was made to approve the bid from CBT for \$27,278 including gutters, screens, downspouts. A grant will be applied for to cover costs.

#### MMSP by Kris and Gina

They are also working on updating the water fountains to include bottle filler spouts.

Alliant Energy and Solar Panels - At this time they are uncertain of progress. Alliant has communicated that their policies have changed and as of 2023 everything needs to be a true 3 phase electrical system. (From Google: Three-phase power is a three-wire ac power circuit with each phase ac signal 120 electrical degrees apart. Residential homes are usually served by a single-phase power supply, while commercial and industrial facilities usually use a three-phase supply.) Alliant is estimating \$72,000 to do the work to get us to a point to be able to begin the phases of the solar panels. Alliant is dragging their feet, and soon we will run out of time to utilize the grant received for the solar panel phase 1. We will need to apply for a grant in order to get the upgrades, but because we have already received one for phase 1, we cannot apply for another for that step. Phase 1 was preparing and placing the solar panels. Fundraising within the church will need to be done to pay. We were given no warning or communication from Alliant that this would be an issue prior to applying and proceeding with the grant. There was no way of knowing this would happen. Alliant also wishes to put the Three phase wiring underground. They plan to do this in the area, but it could be 5-10 years before they actually proceed. The closest three phase electricity is at least 3 blocks away from us. There will be costs to get those lines to us as well. The longer we wait, the more things are going to cost. We are definitely in a tough spot.

Mission - Kris K. - Nothing to update. Discussions were held about new places to give the noisy offering. Ideas/opportunities to be discussed at a later date.

Fellowship- Rich S. - Still working and planning a Christmas Day Community Meal. Meal to be served following the Christmas Day service. This will be paid for through Thrivent.

#### Concerns for the Present:

Communion: should it be held in the aisle or at the rail? - Trying to figure out what people truly want. The rail provides difficulty for those who do not wish to use the stairs or walk up the ramp, difficulty with mobility to kneel, etc.

Ideas about laminated "I Give Electronically" cards to still "give" at offering.

The giving tree has been well received.


