Fall is in the air. The temperature is cooling, the days are getting shorter, and the leaves are displaying the beauty of change. And harvesting has begun! Change is all around us.

In a sermon a few weeks ago I told you about a card I received a while back that says, "The world is a better place because of those who refuse to believe they can't fly." My parents were the first to instill that deep desire to dream and then put in place the courage and the drive to keep on going. I am deeply grateful that they believed that a cornerstone of life is faith expressed and nurtured in worship as well as how they lived each day.
