Caring for Our Communities -Lutheran Retirement Home

Lutheran Retirement Home (LRH) in Northwood, Iowa has provided area families with exceptional nursing care since 1962. To address community needs, both services and facilities have grown significantly during the last 63 years. LRH now provides a continuum of high-quality services – skilled nursing care, assisted living, independent living, memory care, and physical / occupational therapy – all made available in a caring, compassionate, and homelike atmosphere.

More recently, however, retirement communities and nursing homes throughout the United States have experienced major challenges. Organizations in rural areas have been especially hard hit, forcing many to close or be sold, a trend further accelerated by the COVID epidemic.

In recent years, across the country, nursing homes have been closing at an alarming rate, including more than 500 facility closures since the start of the pandemic. In Iowa, at least 40 nursing homes have closed since 2020, due primarily to a persistent nursing shortage.

At the same time, Iowa's population over the age of 60 is growing. The state currently ranks among the top five for the highest proportion of residents aged 75 or older. By 2030, Iowa will reach a historic milestone: more residents aged 65 and older than those under 18.

Rural nursing homes face especially difficult obstacles in providing high-quality care. Medicaid is the primary payer for 62 percent of all nursing home residents, making adequate Medicaid payments essential to continued services. Yet, in Iowa, the average nursing home receives just 86 cents in reimbursement for each dollar spent caring for a Medicaid recipient.

LRH has not been spared the dual challenges of aging facilities and limited financial reimbursement. Now, without decisive action, the organization is at risk of being unable to care for a growing senior population. Accordingly, Lutheran Retirement Home has developed plans to address this situation: to update facilities and support operations by expanding the organization's financial base.

Now, for the first time ever, LRH is in the early stages of seeking generous financial support from the communities it serves. The organization has established a \$1 million goal for its *Caring for Our Communities Appeal*. Funds generated by this appeal will sustain the high-quality care that has characterized Lutheran Retirement Home from the day its doors first opened, six-plus decades ago.
