I like to listen to books while I am in the car or outside walking. The latest book (ask me about the title) talks about the importance of exercise, not eating crappy food and the need for meaningful connection.

Meaningful connections is an important element of all recovery programs, strong faith communities and every ones long-term mental health. I'm hoping that you are finding that in our church community. Community is important in much the same way that family is important. Community is a place to be connected, a place to laugh and cry and simply share a common story of life. In the church we can also say that it is where we worship and give voice to our common story of faith.

Throughout the story of faith we experience a variety of family structures and community structures which calls us into the gift and challenge of life. I think that is part of why we were given the Ten Commandments and a whole bunch of laws in scripture and then Jesus summing it all up by saying "love one another as I have loved you."

Eugene Peterson summarizes what connection/community can look like in his paraphrase of

Colossians 3:12-17 as recorded by in *The Message*:

So, chosen by God for this new life of love, dress in the wardrobe God picked out for you: compassion, kindness, humility, quiet strength, discipline. Be even tempered, content with second place, quick to forgive an offense. Forgive as quickly and completely as the Master forgave you. And regardless of what else you put on, wear love. It's your basic, all-purpose garment. Never be without it. Let the peace of Christ keep you in tune with each other, in step with each other. None of this going off and doing your own thing. And cultivate thankfulness. Let the Word of Christ – the Message – have the run of the house. Give it plenty of room in your lives. Instruct and direct one another using good common sense. And sing, sing your hearts out to God! Let every detail in your lives – words, actions, whatever – be done in the name of the Master, Jesus, thanking God the Father every step of the way.

Community and family are a gift but they do take work. There is lots of space for grace and no place for bullying. There is room for laughter and fun as well as sharing our fears and our sorrows. Now that we have been blessed with warm weather in February and look forward to celebrating Easter in a few weeks, take time to celebrate the community that we have and wonder out loud about how we can invite others in as well as reach out to our neighbors.
