Some of my most favorite memories of growing up are connected to events in our family. A lot of those memories involve traveling and camping as a family. We would head up to our favorite campground and sleep in the pop-up camper and fish in a small boat. All of us neatly arranged in the boat, dad in the back, mom in the front and all of the fishing poles sticking out in the assigned direction. Now that I think about it, my parents should be nominated for sainthood. We traveled most summers. The six of us in our station wagon and pop-up camper one year making our way out to the Grand Canyon and on to visit family in California.

Many of our road trips were to Tennessee to visit mom's family. Every year on the last Saturday in July, the Robinson family of middle Tennessee heads up the hill for the family reunion. This tradition began in about 1880 when my great-grandfather and others met at the family cemetery for the annual clean-up day. The day



was first planned so that they could do the necessary work in the cemetery. As time has gone on the day became more about having a meal together, making any joint decisions and sharing stories. The annual trip to the cemetery became the annual Robinson Family Reunion where everyone brings food, they have a worship service, a cemetery association meeting, and together they tell lots of stories. The annual trip up to the Robinson Cemetery is an important part of my mom's story and when it has worked, I have made the trip to be a part of the ongoing story.

As a community of faith we share a common heritage, a common story. We gather weekly to hear the story of faith. To be reminded of our connection and our part of the story. Summer allows for a different pace in our lives both at home and at church. Maybe as you travel or get away for a break you will be reminded how big the world is and blessed by how faithful God is. Our faith is not just about remembering what has happened in the past but also about seeing God in the present. As you go about your work being the hands and feet of Christ spend some time looking for places you see God creating hope, God is at work, and God is infiltrating the world around us.

Paul, in his letter to the Galatians says, "So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up. So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all, and especially for those of the family of faith."
