PASTOR'S PAGE

The next few weeks the second lesson appointed for Sunday comes from the book of James so I've been thinking that we should take a deeper dive into this New Testament book. First of all, take time to read this 5-chapter book (right after Hebrews if you can't find it). The details about who wrote it and when it was written are very few. Some suggest that James, the brother of Jesus, wrote it while others suggest it was written many years after James was martyred by an unknown follower.

Martin Luther noted that the general themes set out in the first chapter are then expanded to give powerful encouragement for responsible Christian action amid the complex realities of daily life.

Here are a few verses from the second half of chapter one.

16-17 Do not be deceived, my beloved brothers and sisters. Every generous act of giving, every perfect gift, is from above...;

19-20 You must understand this, my beloved brothers and sisters: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger, for human anger does not produce God's righteousness.

22-25 But be doers of the word and not merely hearers who deceive themselves. For if any are hearers of the word and not doers, they are like those who look at themselves in a mirror; for they look at themselves and, on going away, immediately forget what they look like. But those who look into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and persevere, being not hearers who forget but doers who act—they will be blessed in their doing.

There are lots of wonderful gems throughout the Bible but join me in this deeper dive into James. I will a verse in my daily walks posted on Facebook and Instagram https://www.instagram.com/hope_grace_for_today/#

My goal is to walk more and so I invite you into a quick look at our morning walks and reflect of a verse each day in the book of James.

As you read the book of James write down your insights and questions. Pull out a commentary or Google (if you must), and dig deeper into what James says to you and share it with me.

Our mutual work together as a church is to invite and encourage one another into a deeper life of faith. We get to do this through worship, through daily devotions and through our conversations together.
