Lent is an important time in the church year of hearing and living into our connection to the whole story of faith. The forty days of Lent connect us to the **forty days** Noah and his family spent in the Ark with all those animals. It is but a small amount of time compared to the **forty years** that the Hebrews wandered in the wilderness. It also connects us to the **forty days** Jesus spent fasting and praying in the wilderness before he began his public ministry.

Ash Wednesday is just a few days away where many of us who worship will leave with the smudge of ash in the shape of a cross remembering that we are dust and to dust we will return. Other years have included a Shrove Tuesday pancake meal to use up the rich foods such as eggs, milk, and sugar, before the fasting period of the **forty days** of Lent. For some Christian traditions liturgical fasting calls for eating simple food while abstaining from meat, dairy products, or eggs. In the Lutheran tradition we have emphasized focus on self-examination.

I invite you to spend an extra **forty minutes** in worship each week during Lent. Worship on Wednesdays won't be quite 40 minutes but will help give focus and be more intentional in our life of faith. If you are looking at the big picture, this is very do-able.

The **forty days** of Lent and **forty** extra minutes of worship are very do-able for us as it strengthens faith, builds community, and gives voice to our life as God's people. This fits well with the invitation and/or challenge to give up something for Lent or take on a new task. Whichever is challenging and life-giving is a great place to begin. To be honest I am glad the call is not to hang out in an Ark with a bunch of animals or a call to wander in the wilderness. Our call is faithfully journey with Jesus to the cross and resurrection.

We also have a small meal and spent time in fellowship afterwards. I'm hopeful that this group continues on the rest of the school year and into the summer.

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH **PERSONAL CARE** KIT ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping ONE adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging* ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging * Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap
