PASTOR'S PAGE

I have a challenge for you, all of you. Let's live into, ponder together, and listen closely to what God is saying to each of us and collectively as two churches working together. On Easter morning the gospel from Luke tells us of the women going out to the tomb early in the morning with the burial spices they had prepared. They were slogging their way through grief, doing the right thing for the teacher, leader, friend. Instead of finding the body of Jesus they meet two angelic witnesses who ask "why are you looking for the living among the dead." (Luke 24:5)

If you want something to change, you must do the work of change. When the girls were young, I would tell them to look with their eyes and not with their mouth. If you want to lose weight you can't keep eating all the unhealthy food. If you are overwhelmed by your schedule you have to let go of some of the fluff in your life (you're family will probably appreciate it). If you can't hear God's voice in your life, you probably need to turn down the volume of the news or the 'must do's' you are hearing and tune into your life of faith.

Back to the challenge. What is God calling you to do? Are you feeling a nudge to change things up? Instead of taking Sunday mornings as your 'my time' come and join us for worship. How about stepping up your giving to the church, not simply when you worship but set up your direct deposit so you are giving on a regular basis. How about gathering some friends and reading a book together or having a weekly Bible study (the youth do).

I am rereading the book *Canoeing the Mountains*, by Tod Bolsinger and will be sharing more thoughts about what I learn with the church councils but invite you to read along. Lewis and

Clark learned that their canoes wouldn't be useful as they moved past the Mississippi River and encountered the Rocky Mountains.

We are challenged to not dwell on what we have always been doing and expecting it to continue to be what God is calling us to. The two angelic witnesses reminded the women at the tomb of what Jesus had told them and announced that he was not in the tomb but out ahead of them. Jesus was risen from the dead and calling them and each of us to see with eyes of faith what we are called to do.

You are welcome to join me in reading or start a book group that excites you and draws you into a deeper life of faith.
