# **PASTOR'S PAGE**

"But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us." 2 Corinthians 4:7 NRSV

This is the Bible passage used at my ordination. The sermon that day highlighted the importance of the treasure of faith is a central to who we are and how we live. The apostle Paul's use of clay jar is an easy one for us to picture. We can look around our homes, offices, community and see all size and shapes of clay jars or earthen vessels. In her sermon, Pastor Carol Mork talked about us as earthen vessels that carry the message with us. We are all earthen vessels. Different sizes and shapes. Different colors and designs. She even joked about cracks and chips. There's nothing like hearing that we are a cracked pot. Shortly after my ordination I received a large clay pot full of red geraniums. That has been a great reminder all these years of ministry.

The second part of this verse reminds us that the extraordinary power comes from God and not us. Extra Ordinary. All the things in life that we could never pull off on our own. All those times you showed up when someone needed you. All those times that you helped in situations that were well beyond your comfort zone. We talk about the Holy Spirit walking along side of us guiding, comforting, calming us and kicking us in the seat when we screw up. The Holy Spirit helps us to see and realize that what we do and say matters to those around us.

I enjoy looking back over pictures and remembering the earthen vessels, clay jars that have blessed my life whether they did something huge or simply shared life with me. Many of you are those earthen vessels and all of you are called to live your life sharing the treasure of our faith in all that you say and do.

Consider the verse as paraphrased by Eugene Peterson in *The Message*: "If you only look at us, you might well miss the brightness. We carry this precious Message around in the unadorned clay pots of our ordinary lives. That's to prevent anyone from confusing God's incomparable power with us."

Maybe what you could do is grab one of the pots in your home and put a Bible in it to remind you daily of the treasure of faith. Also, keep your eyes open and point out to those around you when you see God's extraordinary power at work.
