Do you enjoy looking at pictures? Lots of us do. Whether you receive and can hold the actual picture or seeing it on a computer or phone, it tells a story. There are pictures in this newsletter that tells part of the story of Lifest. It was a great experience but to know more of the story, talk to one of the youths who were part of the trip. That's true of family pictures,

what we read in the newspaper or see on television. We see part of the picture. Depending on the context and our connection to the event or people in the picture we will wonder and hopefully ask questions.

The same can be said of reading the Bible. On Sunday morning we often hear four parts of scripture. The gospel reading gets most of our attention in worship but each passage that we hear is telling a piece of God's unfolding story of love, welcome, grace, forgiveness, call, calm, hope, and redemption. In worship on July 25, I suggested reading John 6 to listen more deeply as we spend these few weeks focusing on Jesus as the bread of life. I also suggested reading through the book of Ephesians as we will during these same weeks. What are you hearing? What are you wondering about in these passages? What are the pictures that come to mind? What would the feeding of 5,000 people look like in biblical times? What would it look like today?

The next question to ask and live into is how are you part of this picture? Would you be one of the 5,000? Would you be one of the disciples trying to keep up with Jesus? What is God inviting you to do today to live into your part of God's unfolding story of love, welcome, grace, forgiveness, call, calm, hope, hope, and redemption?

As we move into the Fall months plans are being made for the various ways we reach out to connect with our children and youth on their journey of life and faith. We would also like to find ways for adults to connect more deeply in their journey of life and faith. This could be in bible study or book study. I welcome your input on what would be lifegiving and where you would like to participate and/or lead.

The Holy Spirit calls us together for the common. We are called to be church together whether we are in the building or gathered in a spot out in the community. It's a great time to be church and to journey through life together.
