Budapest, Hungary is a beautiful and well-established city that is divided by the Danube River. To the west of the river is Buda and to the east of the river is Pest. Our NEIA Synod delegation was blest to spend a week listening to and learning from Bishop Fabiny and several other pastors and church members about their life and work as church in Hungary. One of the key points for me is how much more alike we are than different. The Lutheran Church in Hungary is about the same work that we are which is to invite people into a deeper life of faith. The one significant difference between our churches is that Hungary is a well-established country with buildings and history that is much older than we are.

The church in Hungary has experienced war which devastated their buildings and deeply impacted how they gather for worship. The second picture on this page with the cross of candles is a cave under the church where people fled as the country was being invaded in the late 40's. They lived in this cave under the Castle Church listening to the bombs falling and hiding from soldiers for several months. Bishop Fabiny read from the journal kept by the pastor of the day.

I'm at the beginning of processing my thoughts and going through my pictures from this trip. My understanding of peace and our mutual work as people of faith is being called to has grown. I hope that we can grasp our part of the church throughout the world. There is so much to learn from our Companion Synods and great ways that we can journey with them. One way we have been involved is through the LWR kits but there are so many more ways we can connect. Please pray for our sisters and brothers in faith. Please pay attention to the news and do your part in working for peace and justice in the world.
