YOUTH NEWS

With things getting much closer to normal, it's been a busy few weeks for our Youth! With the school year ending as well as most of our pandemic restrictions, we change things up a bit. Students who have just completed 6th grade are now allowed to attend Jr. High Youth on Sunday nights from 6:30 to 8:00. Students are allowed to hang out afterwards if they want. Those who just finished 8th Grade are allowed to join both Jr. and Sr. High Youth throughout the summer. Those who just graduated are welcome to continue joining us until the school year starts back up this fall. Senior High Youth is on Wednesday nights from 7:00 to 8:30. All other nights of the week students are able to hang out in the Youthroom until midnight.

We've got 2 lock-ins planned – <u>Senior High on Memorial Day Monday</u> and <u>Junior High on Thursday</u>, <u>June 3rd</u>. The teens have (impatiently) waited for these as they are always a night of fun and fellowship as well as a great chance to invite others to come and see what we do.

DayCamp planning has really ramped up in the past few weeks. We're excited to share with our younger members "On Earth as is in Heaven" from June 7 - 11. Each day from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM we'll have games, snacks, story time, arts and crafts, music and small group time.

We've also been working on getting things ready for Lifest Music Festival in Oshkosh, WI from July 7 - 11. When we went 2 years ago, there were just 2 chaperons and 12 students, this year we've got 6 chaperons and 36 students. I'll share more next month about our plans.

We recently painted the Youthroom for the new upcoming Senior class. <u>Our formerly red room is now bright green</u>. Most years we're lucky to get 5 or more to help paint, but this year they were ready, with 18 kids showing up to get most of it done in one night. It definitely feels like the new color goes along with the new mindset of getting used to how things used to be!

To say the kids have been through an odd year is an understatement. When we were allowed to start meeting last summer, it was 10 people, socially distanced, no games/touching/running around, masks on, no snacks, temps taken, outside. After 13 weeks, the guidelines allowed us to meet in the Fellowship Hall. In November when cases here spiked, we shut down for 7 weeks. After resuming at Christmas time we had almost 5 more months in the Fellowship Hall, and then in the past weeks, we've been able to return to the Youthroom, take the masks off, and return to normal.

I'm thankful for all the kids who have been part of this odd year – and the following students who made it to Youth at least 50% of the time!

Organ Project

Greetings FLC members! I thought it would be helpful to share some of my thoughts about the organ restoration from the perspective of someone who sits on the organ bench and has played this instrument on a regular basis. I notice issues with the organ almost every service, but try my very best to work around them.

The pipe organ at FLC holds a special place in my heart for two reasons, the first reason being that my grandmother, Opal Randall, played this organ as the organist for FLC for many years, and she was an amazing organist and role model. The second reason being that this is the organ that I learned to play on, with my grandmother. This particular instrument is a big part of what drew me to First Lutheran Church in particular when I moved to Northwood, and was looking for a church home for me and my new family. I can't believe that it's now been 23 years since we moved to Northwood, and while I never imagined that I would be the organist at FLC, this church has become an integral part of my life.

In all of the years that I've been attending FLC, there of course have been many changes. We've had changes in leadership, changes in worship opportunities and styles, and changes in membership numbers, to name a few. One thing I believe that has remained a constant for our congregation is our mission, our commitment to upholding our Lutheran beliefs and traditions, a respect for our roots and where we have come from, and a vision for our future.

As we think about our roots here at FLC, and the vision for our future, I believe they go hand in hand. I have a tremendous respect for the members and volunteers who spent countless hours planning, organizing, and raising funds to build our beautiful church, to furnish it with everything needed for not only our services, but our children, and all other small groups as well. The forethought and dedication to the FLC congregational life that those who came before us had, is something we should all recognize and be thankful for. The Wicks Pipe Organ is a wonderful example of the forethought given to the life and longevity of FLC.

Our current organ was thoughtfully selected by a committee 55 years ago, which my grandmother was a part of, and a new organ committee formed in 2017 when it was clear the organ needed some care and repair. This new committee was made up of volunteers, and open to anyone who had an interest in looking into the organ restoration. Members that volunteered and committed to being on this committee all had musical backgrounds, which was very helpful in understanding the information that was provided to us throughout the process. One fact that was established by the pipe organ experts we talked to, and became clear very quickly, was the fact that there were areas on the organ that needed attention and needed to be repaired. The group could easily see and hear these issues as they were pointed out. As a committee, we definitely agreed that repairs should be made to the organ to correct the issues of wear and tear over the years. In the process of repairing the organ, it was also decided we would respect the gift that had been given to this congregation over 50 years ago, and retain the integrity of the pipe organ by restoring and maintaining this beautiful instrument as a fully functioning pipe organ.

Looking at the future of our our worship opportunities here at FLC, it is my hope that we are able to bring our pipe organ to its full potential. I believe the best option to bring our organ at FLC to its fullest potential is working with a company that specializes in building pipe organs. This instrument is already a very valuable asset to our church, and with the proper restoration and enhancements, we will make it an even more magnificent instrument to attract organists in the future. At this time, we live in a kind of "tear it down and build new" society, and I have a strong heart and passion for preserving and restoring history. The investment we make now on restoring and preserving the integrity of our pipe organ, is a gift we will be able to give several future generations, as our parents and grandparents did for us.
