### Catching up on business from 2020: Pipe Organ Proposals

About this time last year, the council made plans to have congregational meetings to take the next steps in repairing the pipe organ. But, because of the pandemic shutdown those meetings have been on hold. The council hopes that by this summer we will be able to safely meet in person to continue the process and want to take time to catch everyone up to speed.

Just what is a pipe organ? Wikipedia defines it thus:

The pipe organ is a musical instrument that produces sound by driving pressurized air (called wind) through the organ pipes selected from a keyboard. Because each pipe produces a single pitch, the pipes are provided in sets called ranks, each of which has a common timbre and volume throughout the keyboard. Most organs have many ranks of pipes of differing timbre, pitch, and volume that the player can employ singly or in combination through the use of controls called stops.

A pipe organ has one or more keyboards (called manuals) played by the hands, and a pedalboard played by the feet; each keyboard controls its own division, or group of stops. The keyboard(s), pedalboard, and stops are housed in the organ's console. The organ's continuous supply of wind allows it to sustain notes for as long as the corresponding keys are pressed, unlike the piano and harpsichord whose sound begins to dissipate immediately after a key is depressed.

As such, a pipe organ is a true acoustic instrument in that all notes produced by the instrument are from air driven through a pipe, much as a trumpet or a flute. A digital instrument, on the other hand, produces its notes via electronics as in a Moog Synthesizer.

First Lutheran was built to accommodate a pipe organ. When the original sanctuary was built (the largest Lutheran sanctuary between Minneapolis and Des Moines) the pipe organ from the old Northwood Lutheran was disassembled and re-assembled in the new church. The current pipe organ, installed by the Wicks Company in 1966 at an original cost of \$34,457, consists of 26 ranks with more than 1,586 pipes, each of different size and shape. The current console consists of two manuals and 21 stops.
