
Sunday School News

From The Pastor's Desk....

Dear friends.

From a worship resource – some words to ponder:

Christians consider Easter to be the "first day." From Easter comes the practice of worshiping on Sunday morning. It is the first day of the week. It is also the "first day" of the new creation, sometimes called the "eighth day" of the week, for on it Christ restored the image of God in the human and in so doing also brought restoration and renewal to all of creation. The Easter season proceeds from and celebrates this "first day." In the fifty days of Easter, Christian communities strive to worship God in a way that illustrates that the body of Christ lives now in the heavenly places and also in the gathered body in the world. (Italics - mine)

And here is our task in this Easter season: to embody Christ for the world!

And how do we do this? I'll reuse some words from my sermon on Easter Sunday:

We are Easter people. Easter people welcome everyone – because we know the gracious gift of forgiveness and reconciliation that God has shown to us!

Easter people listen – not only with their ears and their heads – but also with their hearts as God's compassion - through us - is seen and felt by others!

Easter people give money to the work of the church – not because God needs our money – but because WE need to give – generously – out of gratitude for the gifts that we've been given! And most of all – Easter people have hope and lend that hope to others – even in the presence of our own losses and grief (and there have been many over this past year!) – we share a hope that God will use everything – even evil - for our good - and that the seemingly impossible is actually possible.


