CDT Farrell Kehm '26: Der Kadetten-Ranger


When thinking about where he wanted to go after high school, Cadet Farrell Kehm '26 knew he wanted to attend an institution that would help him grow. "I wanted to use my college years to become an individual that I could be proud of," he says, and he selected West Point because he knew the Academy would invest in him in a way other schools he was considering would not... "but I knew West Point was going to expect something out of me as well." Throughout his 47-month experience, he's never forgotten this tacit arrangement: being an integral part of the creation of Men's Club Lacrosse his plebe year, being named "Soldier of the Semester" as a yearling, serving as a company first sergeant as a cow, and now serving as the brigade academics officer as a firstie. Of course, nothing has been easy (he also completed the U.S. Army Air Assault School; embedded with the 2nd Battalion, 27th Infantry Regiment; and participated in the joint, multinational Exercise Dynamic Victory), but Kehm remembers the words of advice he received from one of his mentors, now-Second Lieutenant Fahad Abdulrazzaq '24, who told him, "You came to West Point to do hard [stuff]; go do hard [stuff]!"

Kehm certainly heeded Abdulrazzaq's advice last spring when, completing a semester abroad in Germany, he petitioned the superintendent of the University of the Federal Armed Forces in Munich to attend the German *Einzelkämpferlehrgang*, the German Infantry School's month-long commando (i.e., Ranger) course. The training tested him physically, mentally, and linguistically. "The whole course was in German," he says. "During our second week, we covered 60 miles in 48 hours, marching only at night, navigating very mountainous terrain using only half-burned or torn maps and a rudimentary compass." In "down" time, Kehm was taught how to skin and

eat a rabbit; catch, clean, and cook a fish; and make bread from straight flour. "The entire course was calorically restrictive," he says. "In the last week, the only thing I had to eat from Monday through Thursday was a raw potato that the instructors had left in a hut we raided and that had to be split among the 12 members of my unit." Eighty German officers and noncommissioned officers started the course; only 23 of them—and Kehm—finished.

Kehm says that those punishing four weeks revealed just how much West Point has prepared him for the Profession of Arms. "The grit, discipline, and problem-solving skills that West Point drills into cadets came out during my German Ranger experience," he says. "Even when I had no idea what was being said, I could still strap on my ruck and keep walking." In fact, Kehm says that his entire semester in Germany made him appreciate the Academy's holistic approach to leadership. "When I was taken out of the system and looked back at what I was missing, it clicked as to how much West Point actually invests in cadets and why it invests it in a certain way," he says. But, again, with investment comes expectation. "Leadership isn't about being a figurehead," Kehm says. "It's about showing up, having grit and fortitude, and plowing through all the hard challenges so you can become a leader who can handle anything." ★

Her likeness was given as a sign to Bishop Zumarraga, who abided by her wishes and constructed a church on Mt. Tepeyacac, the site of the apparitions. Millions of natives were converted to Christianity during the period following her visit.

Our Lady of Guadalupe has been designated as the Patron Saint of the Americas. Examination of the eyes of the image by photographers and optamalogists has suggested that the reflections of Juan Diego, the bishop, and the interperter can be distinguished. Prayer for the sick: Immaculate Mother, Blessed Virgin Mary of Guadalupe, health of the sick, your anointed heavenly hands healed Juan Bernardino and brought us the River of Light, of Life, and of Health: Into your heavenly hands I commend my faith, my hope, and all my sufferings. Tomorrow is ASH Wednesday and the start of Lent.

Lent is a time of conversion and penitence OUR Catholic Church offers believers to prepare for and live the Easter Triduum the mystery of the Christs Passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus. during the 40 days (this year February 18th - March 31st), we Catholics should set goals to help us grow in holiness and help others do the same.

Here are some suggestions to help renew your life in Christ this Lent.

How many are you planning on doing?

1. Receive Communion frequently.

Throughout Lent, attending Mass and receiving Communion is the most effective missionary and evangelizing act in which the faithful can participate. St. John Paul II noted that the Eucharist contains within itself the "world's principle and eternal source of salvation." Therefore, Catholics should take advantage of its benefits as often as possible.

2. Pray more deeply.

Many of us ignore the importance of prayer in our lives. The season of Lent can be an excellent occasion to deepen our relationship with God through prayer. St. John of the Cross wrote: "Whoever flees prayer, flees all that is good." St. Ephrem offers a more practical perspective. For him, prayer forms virtues in our hearts it protects us from anger, pride, and envy. Praying helps us die to ourselves to configure ourselves to Jesus, which is especially needed during Lent. 3. Plan on attending our Saint James Parish Mission

Saint James 2026 PARISH LENTEN MISSION Starting February 25th: The Season of Lent is meant to assist us in preparation for renewal of our Baptismal promises on Easter Sunday by those already baptized. We all will renounce sin and make a "profession of faith."

4. Commit to reading the Bible

Pope Benedict XVI always asked Christians to commit to becoming familiar with the holy Scriptures. Incorporate the Bible into your daily prayer. It is, as the Catechism says, the primary source of our knowledge of God. There are many Bible apps out there.

5. Go to confession!

Do not be afraid. Just go. And like the leper in gospel to be made "clean"

6. Help those in need.

The season of Lent invites the faithful to give our lives for others, especially for those most in need as did Christ, "who became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich." There are thousands of Catholic charities around the world that need our help. Jesus told us: "You will always have the poor with you" (Mt 26:11). This was an admonition to always take care of those less fortunate than ourselves. The poor are the treasure of the Church.

7. Cultivate your devotion to Mary our Blessed Mother

Mary serves as a perfect model for all Catholics: men, women, children, teenagers, mothers, busy professionals, anyone seeking to develop a more Christ-centered life during Lent.




