

UK Tourist E-Visa for Indians

Part 1 – Applying for UK Visa

Step 1 – Check the documents required by visiting here –

Step 2 – Fill the UK Visa form - <https://www.gov.uk/standard-visitor/apply-standard-visitor-visa>

Step 3 – Check your details and Submit the Application.

Step 4 – Pay the Embassy Fee

Step 5 – Book your appointment (Now you don't need to submit the passport at Visa application centre but it's mandatory to carry one)

Step 6 – Upload the documents.

Step 7 – Attend Visa Application Center on the booked appointment date. Where you will be needed to -

- a) Verify the Documents Uploaded
- b) Complete biometrics
- c) Show and verify Passport

Step 8 - After approval you will need to create a UKVI account and link your Visa.

Part 2 – Creating UKVI account

To create an UKVI account visit this website - <https://www.gov.uk/evisa/set-up-ukvi-account>

Then click on the Green Button saying – “Create a UKVI account”

You’ll also need one of the following, if you have them:

- a valid passport and your visa application number - this is a global web form (GWF) number or unique application number (UAN)
- a valid passport and your BRP number
- your expired BRP card - you can use it for 18 months after the expiry date printed on the card

After you create your account, you’ll be asked to confirm your identity and link your account to your eVisa.

What if you already have a valid UK Sticker visa?

1. Check Your Visa Status: Ensure that your current visa is correctly linked to your UKVI online account.
2. Update Your Passport: Ensure that your passport details are up to date in the system.
3. Follow updates from the UKVI website for further instructions.
4. Apply for your visa or e-visa well in advance to avoid delays as minimum it takes three weeks.
