Welcome to Atlanta, Georgia! We are delighted to host this year's reunion and are confident that our gathering here will create lasting memories that will be treasured for years to come.

The Atlanta metropolitan area is home to nearly six million people, making it the 9th largest metro area in the United States. Atlanta, the capital city of Georgia, situated among the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains, has a population of nearly 475,000.

During the 1960's, Atlanta was a major organizing center of the civil rights movement, with Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr and Ralph David Abernathy along with students from Atlanta's historically black colleges and universities playing major roles in the movement's leadership. Desegregation of the public sphere came into stages, with public transportation desegregated by 1959, Rich's department store restaurant in 1961, movie theaters by 1963 and public schools by 1973.

In the decades following the Civil Rights Movement, Atlanta earned a reputation as "too busy to hate" for the relatively progressive views of its citizens and leaders compared to other cities in the deep south. In 1960, whites comprised 61.7% of the city's population. By 1970, African Americans were much of the city's population and exercised new political influence by electing Atlanta's first black mayor, Maynard Jackson, in 1973. Under his tenure, the Atlanta airport was modernized, solidifying the city's role as a transportation center. Today, Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International airport is the world's busiest airport. The opening of the Georgia World Congress Center in 1976 heralded Atlanta's rise as a convention city. Construction of the city's subway system began in 1975 with rail service commencing in 1979.

Atlanta was selected as the site for the 1996 Summer Olympic Games. The city government undertook several major construction projects to improve Atlanta parks, sporting venues and transportation infrastructure. Atlanta is now the 7th-most visited city in the US, with over 35 million visitors per year. Atlanta contains a notable number of historical museums and sites, including the Martin Luther King, Jr National Historic Site, which includes his final resting place. In 2014, the New York Times named the Center for Civil and Human Rights as one of the biggest reasons to visit Atlanta. The center hosts several exhibitions that not only

tell the history of the Civil Rights Movement in the US, but how that period is related to more contemporary human rights struggles around the world. The museum is located adjacent to Centennial Olympic Park, which was built as part of the infrastructure improvements for the 1996 Summer Olympics. It now plays host to millions of visitors a year and several events along its 21- acre landscape.

The Georgia state fruit is the Peach, the state bird is the Brown Thrasher, and the state flower is the Cherokee Rose. The Georgia state song is, of course, "Georgia on my Mind", popularized by famous Georgia native, Ray Charles, when he recorded it in 1960. Georgia is the home state for a few well- known celebrities including—Laurence Fishburne, Tyler Perry, Usher, Spike Lee, Gladys Knight and Jackie Robinson, just to name a few.




