Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection from Fr. Bernard Doré

Joyously proclaim God's salvation among all nations.

Our readings today resound with the joy that God's love brings to all. In the first reading, God tells the prophet Isaiah, all who keep the sabbath free from profanation and hold to my covenant, them I will bring to my holy mountain and make joyful in my house of prayer. The Lord is announcing that anyone, Jewish or not, who desires the goodness, justice, and love of the covenant, he will consider as his people. He will accept their offerings; he will receive their gratitude for his love, and he will welcome their prayers and sacrifices.

The joyful praise of the nations for God's blessings is found also in today's psalm. It resounds with the delight of the worshiping people in the presence of a loving God: O God, let all the nations praise you!... may your way be known upon earth; among all nations, your salvation.

Paul's message in his letter to the community in Rome echoes, in a way, that of the psalm. Paul is addressing a mix of both Gentile and Jewish Christians – that is, a microcosm of "people of all nations." In the part of the letter we heard today, his words convey that everything they are experiencing as a growing Church is part of God's design. The outpouring of God's mercy is for all.

A clear example of this is found in today's Gospel. A Canaanite woman approaches Jesus and asks for healing for her daughter. This is culturally and religiously shocking because she is an outsider and a woman. The Lord does not immediately give her satisfaction, but upon her expression of confidence and faith he commends her for it. Let it be done for you as you wish, he says, and her daughter is healed.

On one level, this is a beautiful story of the healing of an individual. But on a more profound level, following our other readings for the day, we see that it also points to the healing that God desires for all of his people. It is the grounds and justification for us to reach out in love to one another accordingly.

Where do we more deeply experience our oneness than in the body of Christ? Today, let us give thanks for the real presence of Christ and the salvation he brings for all, that we may go forth and joyously proclaim it to the world.

The Wonders of The Mass Priests—Angels on Earth God Rewards Those Who Help Priests

A humble shopkeeper lived in a small town in Ireland with his wife and son. They had very little of this world's goods, but they were devout and went to Mass as often as they could. A young priest, through ill health and over-study, lost his mental balance and was unable to perform his priestly duties. He wandered from place to place, gentle and sweet, giving no one trouble.

The good shopkeeper proposed to his wife to give him a little room in their modest house and give him food. The priest gladly accepted their kind invitation and spent some years with them, going and coming at his will.

Before death he regained the use of his reason and, sitting up in his death-bed, called on God most fervently to bless abundantly these good people: "Give them, dear Lord, a thousandfold for all they have given me, Your priest. Bless them spiritually and bless them temporally." So saying, he died.

Wonderful to say, that modest shopkeeper grew in wealth and prosperity, so that his son became a millionaire, and four of his sisters became nuns and four of his wife's sisters became nuns. He himself lived to a ripe old age.

Those who contribute generously to the education of students for the priesthood receive great rewards, for they could not possibly do anything greater than offer a good priest to God. No one on this Earth can give God as much glory as a devout priest.
