## THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

### Reflection from Fr. Bernard Doré

Today we celebrate The Feast of Epiphany. The word “Epiphany” means “Manifestation or Revelation”. Today, Jesus reveals himself to The Magi who are all Gentiles. The Sacred Scriptures tell us the fact that it is God who always takes the initiative to reveal Himself to His People. When The Jews were slaves and persecuted in Egypt, God took pity on His People and sent Moses and delivered His People from the slavery. God was leading His People towards The Promised Land, during the day time, by The Pillar of Cloud and at night time, by The Pillar of Fire. Today, God is leading The Magi towards The Child Jesus, through the guidance of a star and reveals Himself to them.

In The First Reading, The Prophet Isaiah, rejoices over the light and glory that will shine upon Jerusalem. He describes how the wealth of nations will be brought to Jerusalem, and people will arrive, bearing gifts and praising God.

In The Second Reading, St. Paul explains that The Gentiles are now Co-heirs with the Jews. Through Jesus, they became members of the same body.

The Gospel tells us that The Magi from the East, came looking for the newborn Jesus. The Birth of Jesus greatly disturbed King Herod. He wanted to kill Jesus and asked The Magi to return and tell him where Jesus was. The Magi found Jesus and brought him gifts. They received a message in a dream, not to return to Herod, they departed for their country, by another way.

The Magi are the central persons in today’s Feast of Epiphany. They were pagans who did not know the true and living God of the Jews. Today God reveals Himself to them. He is God, not only for the Jews but also for all peoples of all nations, races, cultures and languages.

Today, we are celebrating the coming of the first Gentiles to the feet of Christ. Let us resolve to make The Magi, our Models, to follow them to Bethlehem and offer him all that we have and are.

## Epiphany of the Lord

### Epiphany Blessing of the Home

There is a tradition of blessing our homes on the Feast of the Epiphany. The lintel of our main doorway is marked with chalk like this:

**20 + C + M + B + 21**

The numbers indicate the year on which we ask God's blessing. The crosses indicate the four corners of the Earth from which all nations are called to God. Some say the letters, C, M and B stand for the traditional names of the three Magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. The letters stand for the Latin "Christus Mansionem Benedicat: which means "May Christ Bless our Home". Use the following prayer with your family this weekend:

**Leader:** Peace to this house

**All:** And to all who dwell or enter here

**Leader:** Let us pray . Father, you revealed your son to the nations by the guidance of a star. Lead us to your glory and our eternal home by the light of our faith in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

**(The inscription: 20 + C + M + B + 20 is made with chalk above doorway.)**

**Leader:** Arise! Shine! Jerusalem, your light has come.

**All:** Kings are led by your shining radiance.

**Leader:** Almighty God, bless this home. Let here abide health and goodness, humility and faith, and every triumph over sin. Let your word be obeyed and fulfilled here, and thanksgiving ever made to you, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, now and forever.

**All:** Amen
