FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Reflection from Fr. Bernard Doré

The Season of Advent speaks of expectation, of trust that, in Christ, God is reaching into our world, bringing salvation and fulfilling the deepest hopes of mankind. The first two weeks of Advent look to The End of Time and The Culmination of God's sanctifying action.

According to The First Reading from The Book of The prophet Isaiah, when The Exiles returned from Babylon, they quickly realized that their journey had not transformed them. Their lives, like the ruined city of Jerusalem, needed God's saving help. If we can honestly admit our need for God, The Exiles' cry can become our own.

In The Second Reading, in contrast to Isaiah's lament, St. Paul highlights God's grace at work among us, keeping us faithful as members of Christ. He reminds us that God's Faithfulness is poured out on us in Jesus Christ.

In The Gospel, Our Blessed Lord Jesus Christ invites us to be vigilant, while waiting for his arrival. Jesus comes to us in several ways, while we await him, doing our work and living our lives. One aspect of our commitment to Christ is a commitment to The Christian Community, to our Church. This means our participation in common prayer, in The Holy Eucharist, in Catechesis and other similar events. As we participate in these commitments, there is not only one but "several" comings of Christ. We see his coming to us in those of our brothers and sisters in need. He comes to us through prayer, giving us strength, wisdom and inner peace.

Therefore, today let us sincerely pray that we receive Christ with open hearts and mind.

Symbolism of the Advent Wreath

Whether displayed in our homes or in our Church, the Advent Wreath is a visible reminder of the 4-week season waiting and preparing for the celebration of the Lord's Birth at Christmas. Advent is also a time of watching, listening, and waiting for the 2nd coming of Jesus in glory at end of time.

The 4 candles, 3 violet and 1 rose, symbolize the 4 weeks of Advent preparation. The rose candle is the signal that Advent is about half over; the rose color stands for "rejoicing" because the Lord is near! As Christmas Day draws nearer, the flames of the candles increase and grow brighter, for the Lord's coming brings light to any and every darkness.

The wreath is a reminder of eternity ... a circle having no beginning and no end and the greens symbolize new life, new growth, new hope!
