ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reflection from Fr. Bernard Doré

The kingdom of God is like a mustard seed. One of the major themes of the Bible concerns the way God brings fruitfulness and growth out of what appears to be sterile and insignificant. Examples of this theme abound: Abraham and Sarah are given a child in their old age; a miserable group of slaves in Egypt are chosen as God's people Israel; Jesus, the carpenter's son from Nazareth, is revealed as Messiah and Lord. But the growth God gives is not divine magic; it always requires the responsible co-operation of human beings. Today's Gospel parable about the mustard seed gives us the chance to reflect on the growth God gives and the part we play in it.

The First Reading from the prophet Ezekiel describes the spread of God's Kingdom as the growth of a tree that provides shade for all creatures-a theme found also in today's Gospel.

In The Second Reading St. Paul tells us that whatever our circumstances in life, we should be intent upon one thing only: pleasing the Lord.

The Gospel contains two parables about the slow but steady growth of the Kingdom of God from insignificant beginnings. It is God who brings about this growth. God's kingdom is a kingdom of love, justice and peace. Each of us has a part to play.

Let us pray that we will play our part well and bring about God's Kingdom in the world of today.

Letter from Bishop Tobin

Bishop Tobin has now signed a formal decree restoring the obligation to attend Sunday Mass in the Diocese of Providence, effective Sunday, June 6, 2021, the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. This means that Catholics, in observance of the Lord's Day and in fulfillment of the law of the Church, are once again obliged to attend Holy Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, unless they are otherwise dispensed for some serious reason such as health conditions. Attending Holy Mass and receiving the Holy **Eucharist Sacramentally are serious** obligations.

Update: Normal Liturgical Practice

In light of updated health guidelines by the CDC, the Governor & RI Dept of Health, the following changes in procedure should be considered in our parishes. Visit **stpaulsfoster.org**.

Indoor Seating Capacity

Seating increased from 80% to 100%

Face Masks

Fully vaccinated parishioners are no longer required to wear a facemask indoors and outdoors.

Those who are not fully vaccinated should be asked to continue to wear a facemask indoors.

However, any form of discrimination should be avoided against those who are not fully vaccinated and those who do not use a facemask.

Continue to Observe the Following

Sufficient hand sanitizing dispensers should be made available at the vestibule of the church which can be used by parishioners upon entering. Parishioners should continually be encouraged to practice proper hygiene.

The distribution of the Precious Blood at Holy Communion to the lay faithful should remain suspended.

We will broadcast the Mass on 107.90 FM on car radios. Those who participate from the outside will be brought Communion if they choose to receive.
