Reflection from Fr. Bernard Doré

Sufferings, pains and rejections are all our human experiences. But these experiences should lead us closer to God. We should find all our hope, consolation and strength in God.


The First Reading from The Prophet Ezekiel tells us that God keeps sending his prophets to preach faith, conversion, peace and love.

In The Second Reading St. Paul tells us that human weakness becomes evidence of Christ's power to save us.

The Gospel speaks of Jesus' experience of rejection by his own villagers. His villagers could not accept him or his message. He was telling them only what he had told others: of the need to change, to repent, to be converted, to love God with one's soul, heart, mind and strength and to love one another. But they failed to listen to him and so they were left in a terrible darkness. He would also experience betrayal by one apostle and denial by another. He would be mocked by His own people who would cry out for His crucifixion. All this, He would endure so that we might have life and have it to the full.

We are never alone in all our sufferings. Should we experience the anguish of being ridiculed or rejected by our own family and friends, we are never alone. The Lord Jesus always stands with us in our times of trial, giving us the grace we need to bear patiently with our suffering.

May the grace of the Most Holy Eucharist bring us consolation and courage as we carry our daily crosses?
