NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reflection from Fr. Bernard Doré

Many times in life, we look for God's saving presence. We look for Jesus to be the great rescuer-someone who will immediately lift us up from our struggles. But we need to take the time to reflect how God is now, or has been, present to us. Let us live our daily lives filled with hope and total trust in God.

In the First Reading, wearied by confrontation in his homeland, Prophet Elijah flees to the land of Sinai, avoiding the death trap by his own people. Discouraged, he asks the Lord to take away his life. But the Lord has other plans and brings him back to the Mount Sinai, where God appeared to Moses. God's appearance to his prophets, and nowadays to his followers, is symbolized not in thunder and lightning or great fire, but His presence is hidden in a "tiny whispering sound". A gentle breeze! God shows him his mission and the way he should die. Elijah's experience is a rediscovery of his own faith, which enabled him to return to his land to complete the mission entrusted to him.

In the Second Reading, St. Paul speaks of the great love and loyalty he has for his own Jewish people, even though they have not accepted Christ as the Messiah.

Today's Gospel speaks about the faith one should have in Jesus. We learn from the reading that the disciples were not able to recognize their Master. But the courage of Peter to jump into the water, after having learnt that it was his Master is worth pondering about. In our daily lives when we have crosses and sufferings, many times we become very discouraged and disappointed. We try to question even His Existence. We fail to go to God to recognize His presence and receive His strength. God will not leave us alone. He will guide us and help us. Let us always approach Him with faith, trust, humility and perseverance.

Today let us pray for the grace to seek God's presence and strength and live always, as God's people filled with hope, joy and trust.

Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us your salvation.

Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Saturday, August 15, we celebrate The Solemnity of The Assumption of The Blessed Virgin Mary, who already shares the promised gift of resurrection in Christ. . This year is not a Holy Day of Obligation but since it is the Solemnity we honor the Mother of the Lord at 9:00 AM Mass.

In our First Reading, The book of Revelation, we see a woman who gives birth to a son. The picture is applied to Mary, The Mother of Christ.

In The Second Reading, in his first letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul points out that Christ was the first to enjoy a risen life and that all who belong to him will share in its rewards. We can apply this reading most appropriately today to Mary.

In the Gospel Mary proclaims the greatness of her savior. Mary was, in many respects, like any and every one of us. She was basically an ordinary person. Her chief characteristic was her openness to God and to other people. Because she had this quality, she didn't take herself too seriously, she had no inordinately high opinion of herself, she thought of God and of others before she thought of herself.

The Immaculate and Ever Virgin Mother of God, preserved free from all stain of original sin, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, when her earthly life was over, and exalted by the Lord as queen over all things.' Mary was close to Christ on earth, she is with him now, body and soul, in heaven. In the light of the Assumption of Mary, it is easy to pray to her with new meaning. She found joy in God her savior. She was the lowly handmaid, who deeply worshipped God and was raised to the heights. From her position of strength, she helps the lowly and the poor find justice on earth, and challenges the rich and powerful to distrust wealth and power as a source of happiness.

Mary's Assumption is the anticipation of our own Assumption. Today, let us pray to Mary with hope and confidence to follow her great example of obedience and doing God's will in our daily lives so that we too can participate in her Glory.
