TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reflection from Fr. Bernard Doré

The Lord hears all who call out to him with love and faith. Today we are all called to have a deep and strong faith in God. Since faith is the foundation of our Christian life, we are also called The Faithful.

The obvious point of similarity between the first and third readings in today's liturgy is that salvation is extended not only to Jews but to gentiles as well. In the prophet's vision of salvation, when God intervenes to save his people, the temple at Jerusalem will become a house of prayer for all peoples. Self-consciously Jesus proclaimed that his mission was to the house of Israel (cf. Matt 10:5-6). Nonetheless, he offers a sign of salvation to a woman who came from the area now known as Lebanon. She was a Gentile. That God's plan of salvation includes gentiles should prompt the entire church, few of whose members are Jews, to offer thanks. Had God not been generous in the offer of salvation, most of us would have been excluded.

Faith is God's gift to us. Faith gives a lot of confidence in our life but lack of confidence creates fear, anxiety, doubts and makes our life miserable. As we see in the story of Martha and Lazarus (Jn 11:21-27), faith gives hope. Jesus chooses the Canaanite woman to speak of faith here especially to prove that he has come to give life to the marginalized and the outcast. The healing act is witnessed by the so-called superior people in the society and they are very much disturbed and at the same time astonished to see the works done in faith. When one believes in something, one learns to wait and make the impossible to become possible.

Faith is the gift of God, therefore, we should pray for the gift of faith. Like the woman in the Gospel who humbly sought the help of Jesus to cure her daughter, we too should seek God's help always with faith, humility and perseverance.

O God, let all the nations praise you!
