# August 30, 2020 Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### Reflection from Fr. Bernard Doré

Our First Reading from the Book of Jeremiah describes the young prophet's passionate outbursts of anger against the God who called him to work against such hopeless odds. Jeremiah confesses that he cannot long maintain his angry refusal to prophesy. The word within him must burst forth regardless of his personal likes or dislikes

In the Second Reading St. Paul, in writing to the Romans, tells us that there are many patterns of life the world will hold out to us to make us happy. Avoid them all, he warns, and prefer instead God's pattern.

In the Gospel, Jesus predicts his passion, death and resurrection and explains about the challenges and difficulties of discipleship. Jesus does not want his disciples to have any kind of fancy notions of following him. Rather, he wants to put before them the harsh reality. Therefore, before giving them an open invitation to discipleship, he foretells his passion, death and resurrection. Here we see the frankness and sincerity of Jesus. We also see that Jesus is not a teacher who only preaches. He, himself, is willing to go though what he demands from his disciples. Peter's response to Jesus' prediction is but human. After all, it is human and natural to avoid suffering and seek happiness.

Suffering for its own sake should be rejected outright. But in the case of Jesus, what Peter fails to see is that Jesus' invitation of discipleship is also in the same line. It is an invitation to strive for the values of the kingdom of God, like justice, peace and love. If suffering comes as a result, then Jesus wants his disciples to face it with courage. Jesus however, does not stop at this. He makes his disciples aware that suffering and death are not the end. They take it to the resurrection. This is the wonderful paradox of Christian discipleship. Now it is up to us to accept Jesus' invitation or not. Jesus calls some to fulfill the demands of discipleship in the most radical way by giving up their lives. But Jesus calls most of us to fulfill the demands of his discipleship, by accepting the sufferings and errors of our daily lives with faith

My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God.
