Reflection from Fr. Bernard Doré

People without spiritual vision are usually people without hope, because they fail to see the possibility of meaningful change in their lives. Faith is both a new kind of understanding and a new way of seeing things.

In the First Reading, Isaiah's hopeful message was addressed to a nation that experienced the crushing bitterness of exile. But even the blind, the deaf, and the lame will dance and rejoice at the approach of God's salvation.

In the Second Reading, St. James remarks that the poor of this world are often those chosen by God to be rich in faith and heirs of Christ's Kingdom.

Mark's Gospel tells how Jesus cured a man who was deaf and who also had an impediment in his speech. It shows that Jesus' work of healing means the reign of God has now taken hold of the world.

Faith does not mean seeing clearly and knowing the answer. It means trusting God amid doubt and uncertainty; being open to truth as far as we can discern it in God's word in Scripture, and in the reality of our lives.

Let us pray for the grace that the poverty of our faith may be enriched by the mercy of the Father who saves us in Christ.

150th Anniversary of the Diocese

Beginning September 8, 2021 and lasting until June, 26, 2022, the Diocese of Providence will have an ongoing celebration of the sesquicentennial of its founding in February, 1872. The central theme of the celebration - embossed on the anniversary logo beneath the welcoming outstretched arms of Christ - is from Psalm 126: "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy."

Our diocesan celebration will begin on Wednesday, September 8, 2021, the feast of the Nativity of Our Lady, with "A Night to Honor Mary" at 6 p.m. in the Cathedral of SS. Peter and Paul, and will continue through Sunday, June 26, 2022, when the commemoration of the 150th anniversary will conclude with a solemn closing Mass at the cathedral at 1 p.m. That Sunday is the closest to the feast day of SS. Peter and Paul.

What to watch?

Start with episode 1 of **The Search**, a 7-part video series (approx. 30minutes each) that asks some of the important questions in life.



What is this journey in between the event we call "birth" and the one we call "death"? Is the journey taking you somewhere, or are you leading yourself to some kind of destination – a destination that could extend beyond your last breath? What do you want from your life during the in between? The questions are there. And, the answers are too.

ORDER OF MASS

The concluding rites of the Mass appear rather brief—even though the Optional Announcements part can seem longer than the homily sometimes! But the conclusion is, in a way, meant to have a "let's get going already!" urgency to it. That's because we come to Mass to go!

The Dismissal in Latin is "Ite missa est" which means, "Go, you have been sent." "Missa" is where we get the word Mass; and it's related to the word "mission".

So, we come to Mass—to be strengthened by Word and Sacrament—so that we can go out on a mission. (In fact, even the Optional Announcements, when needed, are meant to bring to our attention some particular need within the community, or to focus on a particular concern of our mission.)

In the form for the Dismissal we use today, there are four options:

Go forth, the Mass is ended.
 Go, and announce the Gospel of the Lord.
 Go and glorify the Lord by your life.
 Go in peace.

Each of these are our "marching orders" if you will. And when we respond, "Thanks be to God," we're not saying, "Thank God it's over"! Instead we're concluding our Eucharist—our Thanksgiving—by giving God thanks for the grace to go out to our world and families to share God's grace, mercy, and peace.
