Reflection from Fr. Bernard Doré

This Sunday's Readings have been chosen to advance "The End Times Theme" that is so appropriate as we approach The End of The Annual Liturgical Cycle.

The First Reading from The Book of Proverbs says that A Valuable wife is one who not only takes care of today but also tomorrow, putting to the best of use whatever is given into her care.

In the Second Reading, St. Paul tells Thessalonians about The Second Coming of Christ as The Judge of mankind. The Day of The Lord would be unexpected; it would come "like a thief at night".

In The Gospel, through the parable Our Lord tells us that we all shall be judged by God according to the use we make of the gifts, He gave us. He condemns the servant who indeed lost nothing, but never gained anything either. For The followers of Christ who are sincere in their efforts, The Parable has a message of encouragement and consolation. God has provided each one of us with the necessary helps to ensure the final victory. These helps are given according to each one's need.

Those servants in the parable who received five and two talents, used them faithfully and successfully. He who received one talent, needed only one, and could have succeeded with it, had he been a faithful servant. But he proved himself lazy. Let us be wise and make the changes now while we have time and our Books will be in order, on The day of The Lord. God gives us all the means of our eternal salvation, through prayers, penances, Sacred Scriptures, The Sacraments and practice of charity towards those in need.

St. Augustine tells, "God who created us, without our co-operation, will not save us, without our co-operation".

So let us pray that we co-operate with God's grace and truly live a life of faith and remain ever ready to meet The Lord, when He calls us back to Himself and live with Him, for all eternity, in His Heavenly Kingdom.
