**Reflection from Fr. Bernard Doré**


God is continually inviting us to the banquet of a fuller, deeper and more spiritual life, a life worthy of our dignity as his sons and daughters. Let us accept his invitation with all our hearts.

In the First Reading, The image of a banquet is used to describe the blessings God has in store, not only for Israel, but also for all nations.

In the Second Reading, St. Paul is saying that for him poverty and riches, hunger and plenty are all the same. With God's help he can cope with anything life brings.

The Gospel Parable speaks of the invited guests who refused to turn up for the wedding feast, with the result that their places were given to others. The first people to be invited to the wedding feast, but who refused, stood for the Jews. Those from the "crossroads", who accepted the invitation, stood for the Gentiles. The banquet is the Kingdom of heaven. God is continually calling us, as individuals and as members of Christ's Community, to a deeper and better life. The greatest danger facing us is not that we might abandon God and turn to evil, but rather that we might ignore his invitation. We prefer to devote all our energies to goals of our own choosing, thus ignoring God's invitation to something infinitely deeper and better. We are already in the banquet hall, since our baptism; but are we wearing the wedding garment of virtue and grace? God's salvation is open to all but not to those who are without due change of heart.

So, let us sincerely pray for the grace to be faithful, and grateful to our Baptism and grow daily in the true love of God and our neighbors.

### Blessed Carlo Acutis

(May 3, 1991 - October 12, 2006)

For the first time in history you will see a saint dressed in jeans, sneakers and hoodie. Holiness is not a distant thing but very much within everyone's reach because the Lord is for everyone.

Carlo Acutis was an Italian Roman Catholic teenager. He was best known for documenting Eucharistic miracles around the world and cataloging them all onto a website that he himself created in the months before his death from leukemia.

Pope Francis declared him to be Venerable on 5 July 2018, and approved a miracle attributed to him which enabled Acutis to be beatified, a step before being declared a saint.

Acutis was beatified at the Papal Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi on Saturday, October 10, 2020. Cardinal Giovanni Angelo Becciu, Prefect of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, presided.

He is a great inspiration for all of us. Blessed Carlo Acutis attended Mass daily and prayed the Holy Rosary daily. He went to Confession every week. He prayed before or after Mass, before the Tabernacle adoring Jesus Christ truly present in the Holy Eucharist. He used to say "The Holy Eucharist is the Highway to Heaven."
