Midweek Bible Study: "Whom Can You Trust?"

Midweek Bible Study prior to 24 Aug 2025

Text: Psalm 146

Theme: Trusting God's justice, mercy, and eternal reign

Psalm 146 - New International Version

¹ Praise the Lord. [a]

Praise the Lord, my soul.

- ² I will praise the Lord all my life; I will sing praise to my God as long as I live.
- ³ Do not put your trust in princes, in human beings, who cannot save.
- ⁴ When their spirit departs, they return to the ground; on that very day their plans come to nothing.
- ⁵ Blessed are those whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the Lord their God.
- ⁶ He is the Maker of heaven and earth, the sea, and everything in them he remains faithful forever.
- ⁷ He upholds the cause of the oppressed and gives food to the hungry.

The Lord sets prisoners free,

- the Lord gives sight to the blind, the Lord lifts up those who are bowed down, the Lord loves the righteous.
- ⁹ The Lord watches over the foreigner and sustains the fatherless and the widow, but he frustrates the ways of the wicked.
- ¹⁰ The Lord reigns forever, your God, O Zion, for all generations.

Praise the Lord.

Devotional Reading & Reflection

Read Psalm 146 aloud. Then reflect on:

- **Key Verse:** "I will praise the Lord all my life; I will sing praise to my God as long as I live." (v.2)
- Main Idea: Human leaders are limited, but God is eternally faithful and just.
- Reflection Prompt:
- "Where do you tend to place your trust—people, systems, or God?"
- Group Discussion

Use these questions to guide thoughtful conversation:

- 1. Praise as a Lifestyle (vv. 1-2):
 - o What does it mean to praise God "as long as I live"?
 - How can praise become part of your daily rhythm?
- 2. Warning Against Trusting Princes (vv. 3-4):
 - o Why does the psalmist caution against trusting human leaders?
 - o What are the consequences of misplaced trust?
- 3. God's Character and Actions (vv. 5-9):
 - List the ways God cares for the vulnerable (e.g., oppressed, hungry, prisoners, blind).
 - o How do these actions reflect God's justice and mercy?
- 4. God Reigns Forever (v.10):
- What comfort do you find in God's eternal reign?
- How does this shape your view of current events or personal struggles?
- 🛠 Life Application

Invite participants to consider:

- What's one area of life where you've been tempted to rely on human solutions instead of trusting God?
- How can you actively praise God this week—in words, actions, or service?

Encourage journaling or sharing testimonies next session.

Closing Prayer & Challenge

Prayer Focus:

- Gratitude for God's justice and care
- Surrender of misplaced trust
- Renewed commitment to praise

Challenge:

"This week, choose one verse from Psalm 146 to memorize and meditate on. Let it guide your trust and praise."
