👺 Bible Study Lesson: "Comfort That Multiplies"

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 1:2-6 (NIV)

Theme: God comforts us in our troubles so we can comfort others with the same comfort we've received.

NIV Passage Highlight

2 Corinthians 1:2-6 - New International Version

² Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. ³ Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, ⁴ who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God. ⁵ For just as we share abundantly in the sufferings of Christ, so also our comfort abounds through Christ. ⁶ If we are distressed, it is for your comfort and salvation; if we are comforted, it is for your comfort, which produces in you patient endurance of the same sufferings we suffer.

@ Lesson Goals

Participants will:

- Recognize God as the source of true comfort.
- Understand the purpose of comfort: not just relief, but ministry.
- Reflect on how shared suffering builds spiritual community.
- Verse-by-Verse Breakdown
- Discussion Questions
- 1. What does Paul mean by "comfort" in this passage? How is it different from worldly comfort?
- 2. Can you think of a time when someone comforted you with wisdom born from their own suffering?
- 3. Why do you think God allows us to experience trouble if He's the "God of all comfort"?
- 4. How can your story of healing or endurance become a blessing to someone else?
- 5. What are some ways we can be intentional about comforting others in our community?

X Life Application

- Personal Challenge: Write down one trouble you've faced and how God comforted you. Then write the name of someone who might need that same comfort.
- Group Activity: Create "Comfort Cards" with encouraging verses and personal testimonies to share with hospital patients, grieving families, or those in crisis.
- Ministry Outreach: Host a "Comfort & Compassion" night where people share stories of how God met them in suffering.
- Memory Verse "He comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble..." 2 Corinthians 1:4a (NIV)
