A thematic literacy approach teaching through dramatic pretend-play for preschoolers.

- Ukuleles for the 5th Grade Music Classroom

The ukulele is a sweet sounding, kid friendly, inexpensive musical instrument used in the music classroom to foster music literacy.

SES Primary Learning and Positive Play

Engages individual kindergarten students experiencing school adjustment challenges through play therapy.

- Sensory Tools Help with Learning

These sensory tools help students with attention difficulties to focus so that they are able to alleviate challenges and enhance learning.

Adaptive Equipment for Fitness Program

Allows transition students to participate in a fitness program with recreational opportunities and to assist in creating life-long connections in their community.

SUBTEXT Application Licenses

A reading application for grades 9-12 that allows teachers to create differentiated reading groups for students of all abilities and levels. This application helps teachers accelerate learning, keeps students moving forward, and monitors progress electronically.

- Second Step for MBA

A collection of scripted lessons, which help to build students' social and emotional skills which is focused on reducing risk and increasing protection from a range of problems.

The Somers Education Foundation (SEF) has had a banner year, being named Foundation of the Year by the 90 member CT Consortium of Education Foundations in September and receiving a most generous donation of \$100,000 from S. Prestley and Helen Blake in October.
