## ***Week 1***

### **Video 1 – Introduction**

## **CLASS 1**

### **Video 3 - How to read a moot problem**

The following steps to read a moot problem will be discussed in detail throughout the video:

- a) Understanding and summarizing facts of a moot problem
- b) Perceiving the meaning of facts which are relevant to the problem
- c) Identifying parties
- d) Drafting the first statement of facts

## **CLASS 2– RESEARCH**

### **Video 4 - Primary Research**

This video will focus on the various sources of Legal research that could be used for the purpose of mooting. The video will guide in understanding precedents and in knowing how to use case laws while drafting/arguing on a moot problem.

### **Week 3**

For the third week, a webinar will be conducted, which would release an assessment problem. The webinar would be conducted to engage in explaining the assessment problem on a general scale, and in clarifying any doubts that the students may have. Further, the webinar will also help in explaining what is expected out of the assessment, which is briefly a memo of minimum one side of a page.
