Please note that the sample memorials uploaded on the website are only for reference purpose and are **NOT** to be taken as models in terms of presentation and formatting.

The above assignment is the final assessment for your certificate course on mooting. Hence, you are required to pay attention to details and give the best of your efforts. As a part of the submission, you are expected to draft a written memorial from any side of your choice comprising all the 10 parts of the memorial as discussed in Class 3 of the course which includes Cover page, Table of contents, Index of authorities, List of abbreviations, Statement of jurisdiction, Statement of facts, Statement of issues, Summary of arguments, Arguments, Prayer / Relief.
