

Black Walnut Resistant Plants

Black walnut (*Juglans nigra*) is a large tree known for its beautiful wood for building quality furniture. Unfortunately it poses a problem for many garden plants when it exists on one's property. Black walnut emits a substance from its roots called Juglone. This acid makes it difficult for many neighbouring plants to grow. Below is a list of plants that are resistant to Juglone.
