



The songs of **3 Leg Torso** swing, romp, and scamper, building up imagery without words. They're just plain fun. And every song reflects the musical traditions of Eastern Europe, the Middle East, and Latin America.

3 Leg Torso appears on stages as intimate as house parties, and as grand as symphony orchestras. They collaborate with high school concert bands, and they produce scores for film, radio, and TV. They have produced three award-winning albums (**3 Leg Torso**, **Astor In Paris**, and **Animals & Cannibals**). And yet these musicians never take themselves too seriously—they are all about the enjoyment of sharing this music that is both old and new, high-energy, comedic, and whimsical.

On Sunday, March 23, 3 Leg Torso will appear for their final public performance at the historic Raymond Theatre. This will be the last show of the band's farewell tour. 3 Leg Torso and SAL invite you—for the last time—to enjoy a touch of the original, steeped in the traditional!






