





# Levy Fast Facts, how will your money be spent?

The district works hard to be good stewards of your money and is focused on basic operational needs and using your money wisely. To this end, the district has identified three key areas where funding is needed to support your Fire Department.

# Firefighter/EMT Safety and Training:

- most of your firefighters are using only certified for 10 years of use; Firefighter protective clothing is expired protective equipment \$5000 to replace for each irefighter.
  - needed to maintain our ability to **EMT training and equipment is** respond - \$2500 to train and equip each new EMT
- Communications is critical for our team to respond to calls, many of equipment that doesn't always adios/pagers or have very old vork - \$2000 per firefighter our volunteers do not have

# Apparatus Repair and Replacement:

- currently has two apparatus that are The life expectancy of a fire truck is apparatus costs roughly \$500,000 over 25 years old. Replacement 20-30 years. Your department
- Tender 11-1 will be 35 years old in 2025 and has recently started to experience a tank failure.

# **Equipment Repair and** Replacement:

- Much of the **firehose** currently on the apparatus is old and at replacement. Average cost of risk of failure and in need of replacement is \$50,000 per apparatus.
- Air Pack cylinders (SCBA's) all need replacement due to expiring earlier this year: \$22,000
- Many pieces of equipment are needed to be replaced:
  - Portable pump (\$7000)
    - Portable fan (\$3000)
- Portable lights (\$2500)


