





A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Nichols to approve the agenda. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Nichols and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the minutes from the previous meeting on May 7, 2024. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Speer and seconded by C.M. Dodd to approve Blanket Voucher #202410 for Claim #'s 21625-21637 in the amount of \$159,820.60 and Payroll #'s 21622-21624 in the amount of \$2150.00 for a Grand Total of \$161,970.60. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Speer and seconded by C.M. Dodd to approve the purchase orders for up to \$1000.00 to Copiers Northwest for a technician to set up scan to computer for the large copy machine due to clerk's computer crashing and the purchase order to Vision for a replacement clerk computer including programming with an estimate of \$1757.45 including tax, shipping of old and new

computer is not included. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the Utility Bill adjustments for Acct# 1239 a refund of \$1019.42 for overpayment on Final bill (refund to be issued to Community Action Council which is required in our agreement) and Acct# 1559 a refund of \$260.65 for overpayment on Final Bill. Motion passed unanimously.

Clerk/Treasurer Oster notified council that some investments, Local Government Investment Pool and a CD at Security State Bank, were not being correctly reported in previous years on the SAO Annual Report. Clerk/Treasurer Oster and Mayor Willey have been reviewing previous years minutes to locate any documentation about the investments, but have been unable to locate documentation on which fund the monies originated from. Also, she is working on clearing out some outstanding warrants (checks) that are in the system dating back to 2013. Clerk/Treasurer Oster will be working with the State Auditors office on the best way to report the investments moving forward.

Dodd and seconded by C.M. Milanowski to approve the \$75.00 raise to Utility Maintenance Speer for passing his WDM test. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Nichols to authorize the Mayor to sign the contract with Justin Phelps as operator-in-charge of the WWTP as required by our NPDES permit to have a WWTP II operator in the amount of \$1500.00 per month. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Milanowski to authorize Clerk/Treasurer Oster to issue a \$500.00 check to the 4th of July Committee for a donation that was made by Weyerhaeuser because the original check was incorrectly issued to the Town of Pe Ell. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Speer to not renew our yearly subscription with Zoom for Hybrid meetings and meetings will only be available in person moving forward. Motion passed unanimously.




