













You and your bicycle will embark at the Chehalis Centralia Railroad Train Depot and take a scenic train ride. On the way back we will stop at the Millburn Rail Stop where we will unload you and your bicycle. At this stop, our rail line intersects with the Willapa Hills Trail. The location is at Spooner Road which is 7.4 miles from the Chehalis Willapa Hill Trailhead near where your car is parked in Chehalis. We will help you and your bike off the train and send you off on the next leg of your journey. You may choose to continue venturing west on your bike or circle back to the Willapa Hills Trailhead at Hillberger Road, just 1/4 mile from the Chehalis-Centralia Railroad Depot

The Willapa Hills Trail stretches 56 miles from Chehalis in Lewis County to South Bend in Pacific County. Except for the occasional bridge, it is a flat and scenic trail that welcomes cyclists of all experience levels. You will encounter picturesque views of the Chehalis River Valley, farms, woodlands, and charming small towns.

The cost for the train ride and to check a bike on board is \$35 adults (14-61), \$33 seniors (62+), and \$28 youth (5-13). We are offering this Bike & Ride train on the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of each month from June 22nd through September 2024. Rides are at 11 a.m., 2 p.m., or 5 p.m.. The train ride portion of your journey is about 45 minutes from Chehalis to Spooner Road.



Council Meeting August 20th, 2024 6:00 p.m.

The regular meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Willey. C.M. Fiedler, C.M. Milanowski, C.M. Nichols, C.M. Dodd, C.M. Speer, Mayor Willey, and Clerk/Treasurer Oster were present. Attorney Unzelman was absent. Tammy Baraconi from Stoneybeach Consulting was present. There was 1 citizen present.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and C.M. Nichols to approve the agenda with the addition of 2025 Comprehensive Plan Workshop. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Fiedler to approve Blanket Voucher #202416 for Claim #'s 21763-2764 & 21767-21776 in the amount of \$12,973.05 and Payroll #'s 21765-21766 in the amount of \$1,150.00 for a Grand Total of \$14,123.05. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the two purchase orders to Hach for a replacement turbidimeter for the Water Treatment plant with a guote of \$3271.00 not including tax or shipping and for 5 desiccant drying cartridges for the water plant in the amount of \$284.25 not including tax or shipping. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion as made by C.M.

Dodd and seconded by C.M. Nichols to approve the utility bill adjustment for Acct# 1731 a refund of \$4.27 for overpayment on the final bill. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Speer to return \$36,151.29 to FEMA from the Water Reserve Fund for overpayment on the Water Main Loss of Embankment project. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Speer to authorize a meter read Comprehensive Plan. The next adjustment for Acct# 1164 for an incorrect low read and replace with the average for the last 24 months and waive the corresponding overage in the current billing cycle. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Nichols to approve the Senior Citizen/ Disabled application for Acct #1442. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the Senior Citizen/Disabled application for Acct# 1337.1 and authorize a billing correction to reflect the discount for the current billing cycle due to Clerk/Treasurer error in submitting to council in July. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Nichols and seconded by C.M. Fiedler to change the advertisement for Water/Sewer Superintendent to Sewer Superintendent only with a salary range of \$33-40/per hour. Motion passed unanimously.

2025 Comprehensive Plan Workshop-Tammy Baraconi from Stoneybeach consulting provided council with a 2nd draft of the 2025 Comprehensive plan and explained there were some areas that needed revisions and requested that the Town Council take some time to come up with ideas for the vision statement for the Town of Pe Ell. Also discussed were some changes to the Zoning code to help the document be more user friendly and relate close to the 2025 Comprehensive Plan and Workshop will be held on October 15, 2024, information can be found on the Town of Pe Ell website. www.townofpeell.com under the

You and your bicycle will embark at the Chehalis Centralia Railroad Train Depot and take a scenic train ride. On the way back we will stop at the Millburn Rail Stop where we will unload you and your bicycle. At this stop, our rail line intersects with the Willapa Hills Trail. The location is at Spooner Road which is 7.4 miles from the Chehalis Willapa Hill Trailhead near where your car is parked in Chehalis. We will help you and your bike off the train and send you off on the next leg of your journey. You may choose to continue venturing west on your bike or circle back to the Willapa Hills Trailhead at Hillberger Road, just 1/4 mile from the Chehalis-Centraila Railroad Depot.

The Willapa Hills Trail stretches 56 miles from Chehalis in Lewis County to South Bend in Pacific County. Except for the occasional bridge, it is a flat and scenic trail that welcomes cyclists of all experience levels. You will encounter picturesque views of the Chehalis River Valley, farms, woodlands, and charming small towns.

The cost for the train ride and to check a bike on board is \$35 adults (14-61), \$33 seniors (62+), and \$28 youth (5-13). We are offering this Bike & Ride train on the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of each month from June 22nd through September 2024. Rides are at 11 a.m., 2 p.m., or 5 p.m.. The train ride portion of your journey is about 45 minutes from Chehalis to Spooner Road.
