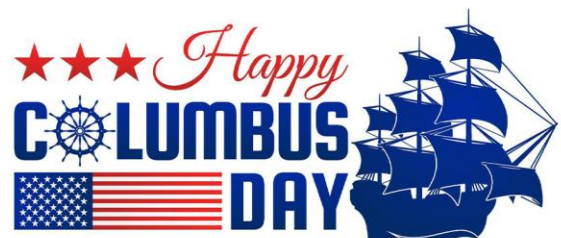

Columbus Day was first celebrated in 1792 to mark the 300th anniversary of Christopher Columbus's arrival in the Americas, and became a U.S. federal holiday in 1937—later moved to the second Monday in October. Once seen as a celebration of exploration and Italian-American heritage, the day has become more complex over time. Many now use it to reflect on the lasting impacts of colonization and to honor Native peoples, with several states and cities recognizing **Indigenous Peoples' Day** instead. Today, Columbus Day continues to spark conversation about how we remember history, celebrate culture, and acknowledge truth.

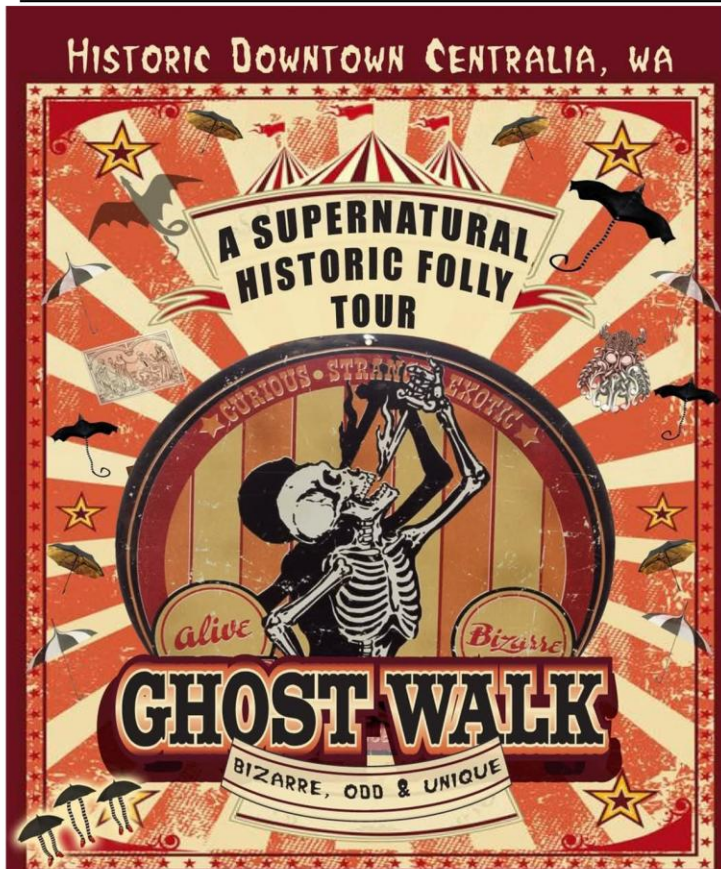

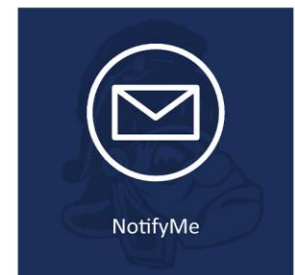

Shellfish managers with the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) announced tentative days of razor clam digs at four coastal beaches from Oct. 15 through Jan. 6. 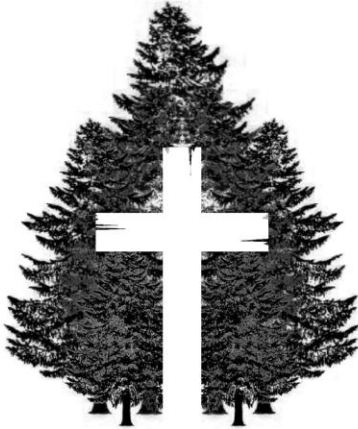
