Columbus Day was first celebrated in 1792 to mark the 300th anniversary of Christopher Columbus's arrival in the Americas, and became a U.S. federal holiday in 1937—later moved to the second Monday in October. Shellfish managers with the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) announced tentative days of razor clam digs at four coastal beaches from Oct. 15 through Jan. 6. All beach openings are dependent on final approval of marine toxin testing, which usually occurs about a week or less prior to the start of each digging series. 
