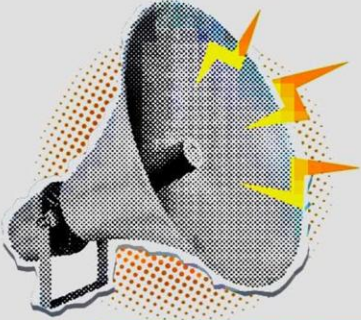

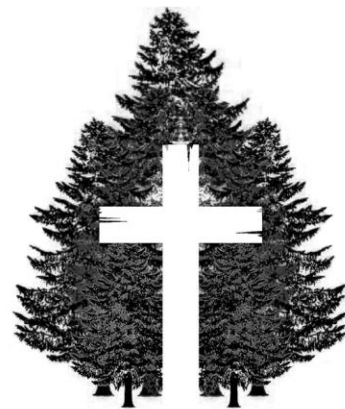

Weather Overview
