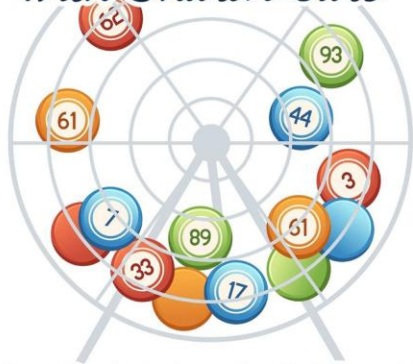

It would be easy enough to promote the enormously talented Gideon Freudmann—aka CelloBop—just by presenting his credentials: Internationally recognized and honored cellist, genre-bending composer, NPR contributor, TED Talk presenter, bandleader, recording artist, and soundtrack creator for Buster Keaton classics. He has brought the electric cello to audiences worldwide and has metaphorically knocked their socks off.

Mr Friedmann has been a favorite of Sunday Afternoon Live audiences. In an earlier review of CelloBop, it was noted that he was one of those artists who can't not create. From his childhood beginnings with the cello, he "felt compelled to play". He did play, and played, continuously flinging his musical creations out there for any and all to enjoy, whether his cello was producing classical or quirky, blues or Middle Eastern. He found humor in every odd corner and banished stuffiness from his performances.

By following no one's road map but his own, Mr Friedmann has succeeded in opening up a new musical landscape to anyone wanting to go for a wild but sweet ride. In fact, catch his very funny "Flying Cars" video on YouTube. In the same vein, "Holiday Party" will convince the listener that this cello can tell a slightly naughty tale. Gideon Freudmann uses the modern innovations of his electric cello to loop through many musical layers, moods, and genres. The cello becomes a percussion instrument, a recording machine, a producer of strange and beautiful sound effects.

In short, CelloBop is not chamber music—at least not your grandma's chamber music. So don't be afraid of the cello! This one will take you on a magic carpet ride and make the most surprising stops along the way.

This course is flat as heck. It's a great option if you're looking set a new personal best finish time, or if you're running to complete your first ultra! Its seriously like a pancake. Its without doubt one the flattest and fastest 100 mile and 50 mile courses you'll find in the PNW.

The Willapa Trail Festival Footraces starts and finishes at Owl and Olive Cafe, a beautiful event space located between the Willapa Hills State Park Trail and the banks of the upper Chehalis River. The 56 mile Willapa Hills Trail follows an old rail grade traversing the rolling hills and rivers of scenic southwest Washington from Chehalis to Raymond and ending in South Bend along the Willapa River and Willapa Bay. Running along this beautiful trail in autumn makes for an excellent running event experience for our modest entry fees.

Race Entry

OlyTrailRunners is a non-profit dedicated to supporting the local trail running community and preservation of recreational trails in the greater Olympia area. To keep our events inclusive and promote running for everyone we keep our entry fees low. The 5k will be \$20. The 25k will be \$30. The 50k will be \$35. The 50 miler will be \$45. The 100 miler will be \$100.

A portion of the profits will be used to improve and maintain the Willapa Hills Trail and support the communities it runs through.

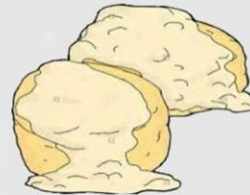

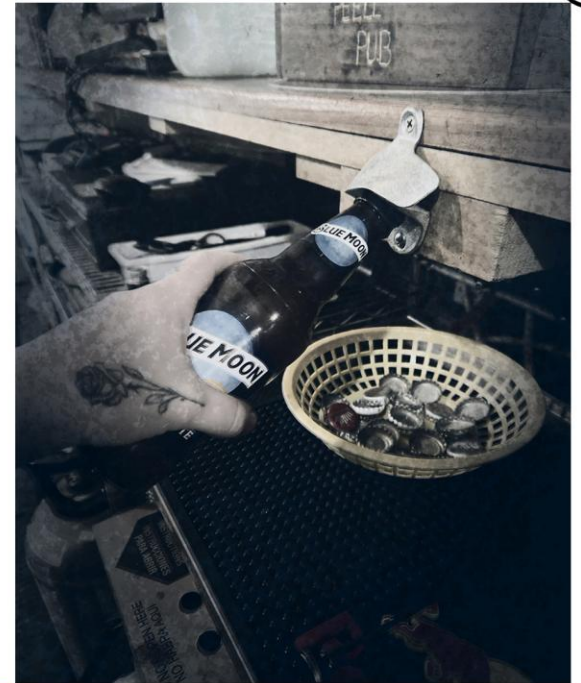
