Every gift, donation, volunteer hour, and kind word helped make this season brighter for those who needed it most.



HONORING MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.



Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. remains one of the most influential leaders in American history, known for his unwavering commitment to equality, justice, and civil rights. Born on January 15, 1929, in Atlanta, Georgia, Dr. King became the face of the Civil Rights Movement through his dedication to nonviolent protest and his powerful ability to inspire change through words and action.

Guided by the principles of peaceful resistance taught by Mahatma Gandhi, Dr. King believed that lasting change could be achieved without violence. He led marches, boycotts, and demonstrations that challenged racial segregation and discrimination across the United States. That same year, Dr. King was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in recognition of his commitment to peaceful social change.

Despite facing threats, opposition, and violence, Dr. King never wavered in his mission. His life was tragically cut short when he was assassinated on April 4, 1968, in Memphis, Tennessee. However, his legacy continues to live on.

In 2026, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. is still celebrated as a symbol of courage, unity, and hope. His work reminds us that the fight for equality is ongoing and that every generation has a role to play in building a more just and inclusive society. Through service, advocacy, and compassion, we honor his vision and continue the work he began.


