Thanksgiving is a holiday with deep roots in American history, tracing its origins back to the early 17th century. The most widely recognized origin story dates back to 1621 when Pilgrims, who had arrived in Plymouth, Massachusetts, aboard the Mayflower, celebrated a bountiful harvest alongside Native Americans. This feast is often considered the first Thanksgiving and is symbolic of cooperation and gratitude between the Pilgrims and the Wampanoag people.

Over the years, Thanksgiving evolved into a time for expressing gratitude for the blessings of the harvest and the preceding year. However, it wasn't until the 19th century that Thanksgiving became an official national holiday. In 1863, during the Civil War, President Abraham Lincoln proclaimed Thanksgiving a national holiday, setting the date as the final Thursday in November. Later, in 1941, Congress officially established Thanksgiving as the fourth Thursday in November, where it stands today.

Modern Thanksgiving celebrations are characterized by family gatherings, feasts, and expressions of gratitude. Many people participate in the tradition of preparing and sharing a large meal with loved ones, featuring a roasted turkey as the centerpiece. The holiday also often involves reflecting on one's blessings and taking time to appreciate the people and experiences that bring joy and fulfillment. Parades, football games, and various festive activities have become integral parts of the Thanksgiving tradition, making it a cherished occasion for many Americans.






Free Park Day!

A motion was made by C.M.

Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Nichols to approve Blanket Voucher #202422 for Claim #'s 21888, 21891-21901 in the amount of \$18,980.80 and Payroll #'s 21889-21890 in the amount of \$1,150.00 for a Grand Total \$20,130.80. Motion passed unanimously.

Scott Betcher from the Chehalis River Basin Flood Authority gave a presentation regarding projects that have been completed within the Chehalis River Basin to reduce the impact of flood on people and aquatic species.

A motion was made by C.M. Speer and seconded by C.M. Fiedler to accept letters of interest for Council Position #5 that will be vacated at the end of 2024 until 4:00 p.m. on December 10th and will make a formal decision to fill the vacancy at the regular meeting scheduled for December 17th. Motion passed unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARING- The public hearing for the 2025 Property Tax levy was opened at 6:41 p.m. by Mayor Willey. C.M. Nichols expressed concern regarding raising any property taxes to our citizens since the Fire Dept. Levy and the 911 sales tax passing during the election.

Clerk/Treasurer Oster noted that the 2024 property tax rate the Town of Pe Ell is

\$1.158312883635 per \$1000 of assessed value, \$97,491.98. The 1% lawful increase for 2025 would be \$984.58. There were no other questions or comments. The Public Hearing was closed at 6:48 p.m.

A motion was made by C.M. Speer and seconded by C.M. Dodd to pass Resolution #277- 2025 Property Tax levy. Vote was: Yays- C.M. Dodd, C.M. Speer, C.M. Fiedler, C.M. Milanowski Nay's- C.M. Nichols

Mayor Willey informed council that he has spoken with our previous Water-Sewer Superintendent Ryan Webster and will be bringing him back on board the first week of December and will be making some budget changes to reflect the hire.

A motion was made by C.M.

Dodd and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the Senior Citizen/Disabled Low Income application for Acct# 1448. Motion passed unanimously.






