

Step outside on Saturday, April 12, to witness April's full Pink Moon. This Paschal Moon marks the first full Moon of spring and is used to determine the date of Easter. This month also brings a micomoon.

For the best view of this stunning spring Moon, head to an open area and watch as it rises above the horizon. At this moment, it will appear larger than usual due to the Moon illusion and take on a beautiful golden hue!

The full Moon on April 12, 2025, occurs just before reaching apogee. Apogee refers to the point when the Moon is farthest from Earth. When the full Moon occurs near this point, it's classified as a "micromoon"—the opposite of a supermoon. Since this full Moon happens about 22 hours before apogee, it will appear slightly smaller and dimmer than usual.

While the name "Pink Moon" might suggest a rosy-colored Moon, the reality is a bit less magical. The name comes from the early spring bloom of a wildflower native to eastern North America: Phlox subulata, commonly known as creeping phlox or moss phlox. This flower, often called "moss pink," was in full bloom around April's full Moon.

Thanks to this seasonal connection, the April full Moon became known as the "Pink Moon!







#### **Hydrant Flushing**

The Town of Pe Ell Water Department will begin its biannual hydrant-flushing program on April 14, 2025, to April 18, 2025. Flushing will occur between 8:00am and 3:00pm. These dates and times are approximate and are subject to change due to scheduling and/or weather conditions.

Customers may experience discolored water, low water pressure, or a disruption in water service during this time. Residents are urged to reduce water use and consumption during flushing periods. Please wait until the evening hours (after 4:00pm) to do laundry and please refrain from using bleach, as bleach enhances iron levels in the water and can cause discoloration in clothing. If you find that your water appears cloudy or discolored, open all cold-water faucets and wait until the water runs clear before using it.

#### What's happening?

The Town of Pe Ell is using fire hydrants to discharge a large volume of water from the water system.

#### Why flush fire hydrants?

- 1) To clean water lines
- 2) To ensure hydrants are working properly

By discharging a large volume of water through a fire hydrant, water flow within the pipeline is increased. This increased flow scours the inside of the pipeline, removing and then transporting silt, rust and mineral deposits out of the water system. In addition, this process provides the Town with the opportunity to assess the general condition of the hydrant.

#### Can I drink from the tap during hydrant flushing?

As water is flushed through water lines and out the hydrant, silt and mineral sediment can cause water to become discolored. Although the water may not be visually appealing, it is safe to drink and continues to meet all federal and state drinking water standards. There is no health hazard associated with the discolored water.

#### How long does hydrant flushing take?

Fire hydrant flushing typically takes 15 minutes to several hours, but discolored water may last up to 4 hours.

#### How does hydrant flushing affect me?

The main impact of hydrant flushing is discolored water. Here's what you should do if hydrant flushing is taking place in your neighborhood:

- If possible, avoid using water while the hydrant flushing is taking place. By not taking water
  from the tap or running appliances that use water (dishwashers and washing machines), you can
  prevent discolored water from entering your household plumbing altogether.
- Don't do laundry while hydrant flushing is taking place. The discolored water can sometimes stain fabrics. Wait until water runs clear at the tap before using your washing machine and wash a load of dark clothes first. Rust will stain light colored laundry. When hydrants near you are being tested, please be sure that both your cold and hot water are rust-free before you launder any whites. If such staining occurs, there is a remedy. Most grocery and hardware stores carry laundry aids which remove rust stains.
- If you encounter discolored water following hydrant flushing, run the cold-water taps throughout
  your home (bathroom sinks and tubs, kitchen faucets, etc.) for 5 to 10 minutes or until water
  clears. This allows discolored water to work its way out of your household plumbing. Better yet,
  collect it and use it to water your lawn or your plants. They don't mind a bit.
- If, after hydrant flushing, your water pressure or volume seems low, clean faucet screens to remove silt and mineral sediment that could be obstructing water flow.
















#### Give your child a strong start

ESD 113 Special Education Co-op is offering free Child Find screenings to children ages 0-5 in Cosmopolis, Evaline, Griffin, Hood Canal, Mary M. Knight, McCleary, Pe Ell, Raymond, White Pass, Willapa Valley, and Wishkah Valley school districts. Screenings are quick, easy, and help identify any needs early so families can access opportunities and resources.

#### What is Child Find?

Child Find helps identify developmental delays in children ages 0-5. Through professional screenings, it assesses areas like speech, motor skills, learning, vision, hearing and social-emotional development. Families are also connected with resources to support their child's growth and success.

#### How to schedule a screening

#### **Step 1:** Contact your district

Call Pe Ell Elementary at 360-291-3244. If you're unsure which district you belong to, contact the ESD 113 Special Education Co-op at 360-748-3384 for assistance.

Families in temporary situations can contact their current district to access this service.

#### Step 2: Prepare for the screening

Make sure your child wears comfortable clothes and shoes that allow for movement. Gather any relevant medical or developmental information to share during the appointment, if needed.

Screenings for children 0-3 years old take about 30 minutes, while screenings for children 3-5 years old take 1-1.5 hours and are more comprehensive.

#### Step 3: Attend the screening

Arrive at the designated location, and bring your child to participate in the developmental assessments. You'll receive feedback and recommendations after the screening.
