Free Park Day!

Washington State Parks and the Washington Departments of Fish & Wildlife (WDFW) and Natural Resources (DNR) offer several "free days" when a Discover Pass is not required to visit these lands.

Nov. 11 — Veterans Day

Free days apply only to day use (not overnight stays or rented facilities). Free days are valid at state parks and Washington State Departments of Natural Resources and Fish & Wildlife lands. Sno-Park permits are still required on free days at designated Sno-Parks during the winter season.

Veterans Day, originally known as Armistice Day, has its origins in the aftermath of World War I. On November 11, 1918, the armistice was signed, marking the end of hostilities on the Western Front and effectively ending World War I. The date was chosen to commemorate the cessation of fighting and honor the soldiers who had served during the war. In 1938, Armistice Day became a federal holiday, dedicated to the cause of world peace. In 1954, following World War II and the Korean War, the holiday was renamed Veterans Day to honor all American veterans.

There are various ways to celebrate and honor Veterans Day. Many communities hold parades, where veterans, active-duty military personnel, and their families are recognized and applauded for their service. Flag-raising ceremonies and wreath-laying events at war memorials are also common. Schools often organize special programs to educate students about the importance of Veterans Day and the sacrifices made by veterans. Supporting veterans through charitable donations, volunteering at veterans' hospitals, and participating in events organized by veterans' organizations are additional ways to show appreciation. Ultimately, taking a moment of reflection and gratitude to thank veterans for their service is a simple yet powerful way to honor their contributions to the nation's security and freedom.



November's full Beaver Supermoon reaches peak illumination on Friday, November 15, 2024. This is our fourth and final Supermoon of the year! This means that it will appear bigger and brighter than normal! The Beaver Moon reaches peak illumination at 1:29 P.M. Why the "Beaver" Moon? This is the time of year when beavers begin to take shelter in their lodges, having laid up sufficient food stores for the long winter ahead. During the fur trade in North America, it was also the season to trap beavers for their thick, winter-ready pelts. November's Moon names highlight the actions of animals preparing for winter and the onset of the colder days ahead. Digging (or Scratching) Moon, a Tlingit name, evokes the image of animals foraging for fallen nuts and shoots of green foliage and bears digging their winter dens. The Dakota and Lakota term Deer Rutting Moon refers to the time when deer seek mates, and the Algonquin Whitefish Moon describes the spawning time for this fish.

"You know you're from southwest Washington if you've heard of Skamokawa." This may be the secret password for admission to Sunday Afternoon Live's November 17 presentation of Skamokawa Swamp Opera. But only if you pronounce it correctly! "Skamokawa": skah-mah-kah-way. It's a Chinook word for smoke or fog over water, fittingly. This completely unusual ensemble is also completely impossible to categorize. Skamokawa Swamp Opera is comprised of four musicians, trained in the classics but also crackerjack players of disco, jugband, grunge, emo, soul, rock, torch, and country. It's as if chamber music went for a walk in the deep woods and came out performing "My Girl", "I Will Survive", "All Along The Watchtower", "Sweet Dreams", Nirvana's "All Apologies", and finished with "Black Coffee" by Peggy Lee. With cello, mandolin, banjo, guitar, an upended washtub, beribboned tambourine, and the sweetest vocal harmonies, Skamokawa Swamp Opera is the soul of genre-bending.

How eclectic is this outfit? Skamokawa Swamp Opera's percussionist is a former member of Giants In The Trees, the band led by Nirvana's Krist Novoselic. SSO was founded by a classically trained cellist and features two angel-voiced vocalists who each sang the part of Fantine in Les Miserables. To top it all off, Skamokawa Swamp Opera has a distinctlysteampunk sensibility.

Besides performing the music of other artists in their own inimitable way, SSO members are the creators of music that could come only from the cool, mossy forests of Wahkiakum County. Literally. If you've ever found yourself shaking your head when reading the police blotter in a small-town newspaper, SSO's "Wahkiakum County Sheriff's Report" (volumes 1 and 2) are for you. "Mountain Gold" is a tribute to the chanterelle mushrooms many of us have foraged for in the woods. "Celeste Brown (sweet and round)" recalls treasures found at yard sales.

Yes, Skamokawa Swamp Opera defies pigeonholing. And yet, this band demands attempts at description—which is to say that they must be seen and heard to be believed. So join us on Sunday, November 17 and see them for yourself: the quirky, rustic, very-southwest-Washington Skamokawa Swamp Opera!

Skamokawa Swamp Opera will perform at the historic Raymond Theatre, 323 3rd St, Raymond, WA on Sunday, November 17 at 2 PM. 
