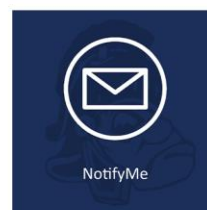

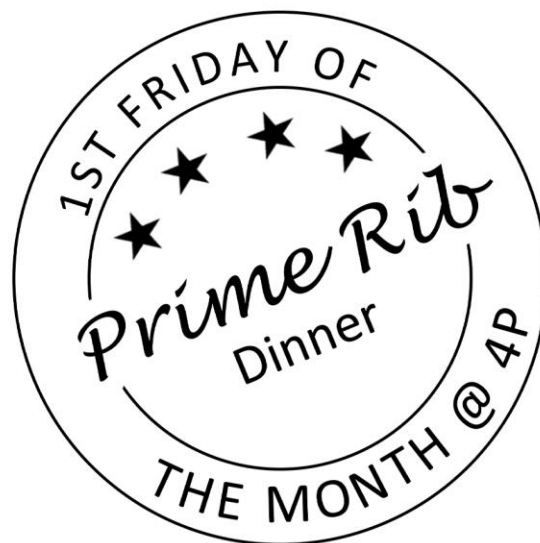

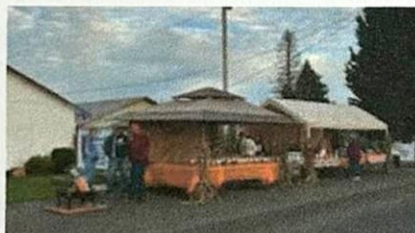

Levy Fast Facts, how will your money be spent?

The district works hard to be good stewards of your money and is focused on basic operational needs and using your money wisely. To this end, the district has identified three key areas where funding is needed to support your Fire Department.

Firefighter/EMT Safety and Training:

- **Firefighter protective clothing** is only certified for 10 years of use; most of your firefighters are using expired protective equipment - \$5000 to replace for each firefighter.
- **EMT training and equipment** is needed to maintain our ability to respond - \$2500 to train and equip each new EMT
- **Communications** is critical for our team to respond to calls, many of our volunteers do not have radios/pagers or have very old equipment that doesn't always work - \$2000 per firefighter

Apparatus Repair and Replacement:

- The life expectancy of a fire truck is 20-30 years. Your department currently has two apparatus that are over 25 years old. Replacement apparatus costs roughly \$500,000 each.
- **Tender 11-1** will be 35 years old in 2025 and has recently started to experience a tank failure.
- **Engine 11-2** will be 30 years old in 2025 and has been out of service since March due to a pump failure that will require substantial repairs.
- **Aid 11-1**, while a newer chassis, the box is near 30 years old and starting to fail and will require replacement soon.

Equipment Repair and Replacement:

- Much of the **firehose** currently on the apparatus is old and at risk of failure and in need of replacement. Average cost of replacement is \$50,000 per apparatus.
- **Air Pack cylinders** (SCBA's) all need replacement due to expiring earlier this year: \$22,000
- Many pieces of equipment are needed to be replaced:
 - **Portable pump** (\$7000)
 - **Portable fan** (\$3000)
 - **Portable lights** (\$2500)

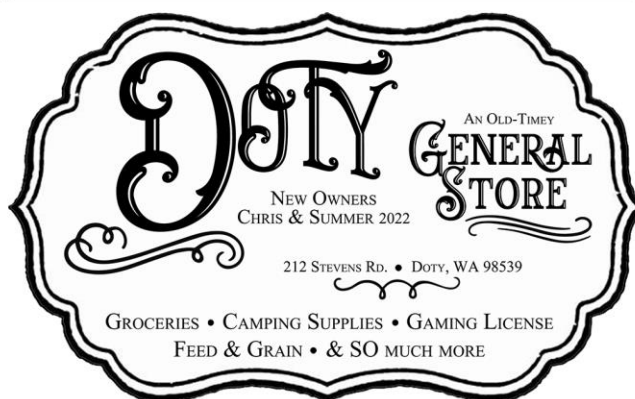

October 15th, 2024
6:00 p.m.

The regular meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Willey. C.M. Dodd, C.M. Speer, C.M. Fiedler, C.M. Nichols, C.M. Milanowski, Mayor Willey, and Clerk/Treasurer Oster were present. Comprehensive Plan Consultant Tammy Baraconi was also present. Attorney Unzelman was absent. There were no citizens present.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Nichols to approve the agenda. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Speer and seconded by C.M. Fiedler to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Dodd to approve Blanket Voucher #202420 for Claim #'s 21845-21846 and 21849-21857 in the amount of \$20,855.22 and Payroll #'s 21847-21848 in the amount of \$1,150.00 for a Grand Total of \$22,005.22. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the purchase orders for High yield toner for the Clerk's printer from Quill in the amount of \$416.56 and a purchase order to Service Saw for Stihl MS271 Chain saw with 20" bar and a Stihl BR450 Backpack Blower in the amount of \$865.68 council also authorized extended warranties if available. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Nichols to approve the utility bill

adjustment for Acct# 1322 to waive the overage of \$108.00 for a leak in the service line. Motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Nichols to set Budget Public Hearings for November 5th-Preliminary Budget, November 19th for Property Tax & Revenue, and November 26th for the Final Budget. Motion passed unanimously.

There was no motion to schedule Budget Workshops

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Milanowski to authorize Clerk/Treasurer Oster to transfer the remaining ARPA funds, \$47,672.01, from Current Expense Fund to the Sewer Fund for the WWTP-Lift Station upgrade project. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Speer to pass and authorize Mayor Willey to sign Resolution #276- Chehalis River Basin-wide solution to flooding and aquatic species restoration. Motion passed unanimously.

2025 Comprehensive Plan Workshop- Council and consultant Tammy Baraconi discussed the 2025 Comprehensive plan and the required changes by Washington state. Additional workshops are scheduled for November 5th and December 3rd. Council also created the vision statement for the document.

ADJOURN

A motion was made by C.M. Speer and seconded by C.M. Fiedler to adjourn the meeting at 7:01 p.m. Motion passed unanimously.
