

Thanksgiving has become one of America's most cherished traditions, but its origins reach back more than four centuries. The holiday traces its beginnings to the fall of 1621, when the Pilgrims of Plymouth Colony gathered with members of the Wampanoag Nation to share a harvest meal. After surviving a difficult first year, the settlers relied heavily on Indigenous knowledge to grow crops and adapt to the land. Their shared feast—lasting three days—later became recognized as the symbolic “First Thanksgiving,” representing cooperation, gratitude, and survival.



The idea of setting aside a national day of thanks grew slowly over time. Throughout the 1700s and early 1800s, individual colonies and states held their own Thanksgiving observances on various dates. It wasn't until 1863, in the midst of the Civil War, that President Abraham Lincoln declared a national Thanksgiving holiday, hoping it would help bring unity and reflection to a divided nation. His proclamation established the tradition of giving thanks annually, and in 1941, Congress officially set the holiday as the fourth Thursday of November, the date we still follow today.

In 2025, Thanksgiving continues to be a celebration centered on gratitude, family, and community. While turkey dinners, pumpkin pie, parades, and football remain beloved traditions, many families also use the holiday to honor both its historical complexities and its message of thankfulness. Today's celebrations often blend long-standing customs with new ones—volunteering in the community, reaching out to neighbors, and taking time to appreciate the people and moments that bring meaning to the past year. Thanksgiving has evolved, but its heart remains the same: a time to gather, reflect, and give thanks.
